



Sit higher and learn with Western

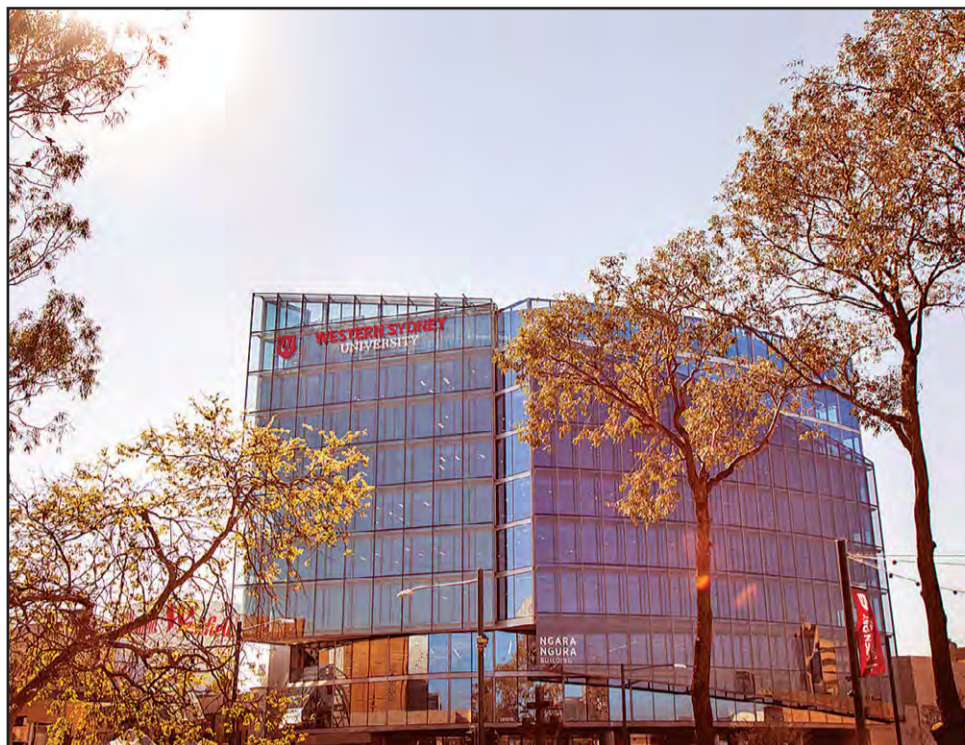
WESTERN Sydney University has named its new high-rise Liverpool City campus Ngara Ngura, which translates to “come in, sit with us, and learn” in the Aboriginal language.

Ngara Ngura sends a message of welcome and community that echoes the university’s role as an accessible and quality tertiary education provider to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and the broader community.

The university serves a region with the highest urban Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population in Australia, occupying sites on Darug, Tharawal, Gandangarra, Bundjalung and Wiradjuri traditional lands.

The campus on 100 Macquarie Street, Liverpool, sits on the land of the Gahbrogal Clan of the Darug Nation. It was officially opened in June this year by former Treasurer and now Prime Minister of Australia, Scott Morrison.

Spanning nine floors, the vertical campus will deliver programs in nursing and midwifery with access to high-tech teaching laboratories. Social sciences and psychology courses will

also be taught at the campus. Ngara Ngura can accommodate up to 2,500 students, including up to 750 nursing students.

The University’s start-up incubator, LaunchPad, will also be housed in the Liverpool campus, and

provides unprecedented access to state-of-the-art facilities for technology-based businesses in Western Sydney.

The campus will play a pivotal role in the growing region of Liverpool where it will drive innovation,

knowledge, job generation, and industry attraction ahead of the coming airport and aerropolis.

Sitting at the heart of Liverpool city, the campus is within walking distance to public transport, is located adjacent to Westfield



shopping centre, and is just minutes from Liverpool Hospital where nursing and midwifery students can elect to do the practical component of their degree.

New facilities

The following facilities are offered at Liverpool city campus:

- Badanami Centre providing dedicated support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students.
- Student collaborative teaching environments with social learning spaces.
- Quiet and silent study areas.
- Online meeting rooms to join online activities and work with others beyond

the campus.

- A space dedicated to games, kitchen facilities, clubs and social engagement.
- Café on the ground floor.

In particular, the library takes up a whole floor with silent and flexible spaces for students. The design is modelled to complement the curriculum, assessment and activity that is expected at Liverpool.

The Wi-Fi-enabled campus boasts one of Australia’s most technologically advanced, student-only zones, sleeping pods and Zoom capabilities within classrooms, ensuring students remain supported and connected throughout their time at the university.
