ESTABLISHED in 2018, the Sandra Cadwallader Indigenous Economics Scholarship has been generously donated by Peter and Sandra Cadwallader to support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students undertaking a Bachelor of Economics degree at the University of Sydney.

Scholarship

The scholarship, valued at \$50,000 a year, will provide financial support to successful applicants helping towards their study and living expenses throughout their Bachelor of Economics degree.

Both Sandra and Peter have a history of philanthropic engagement aimed at inspiring independence and creating new social opportunities.

Earlier this year Peter and Sandra were delighted to meet with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander high school students taking part in the University of Sydney's Wingara Mura-Bunga Barrabugu Summer Program.

The week-long academic residential program is

designed to help students understand how their study choices can influence their future including the possibilities offered by higher education.

Ms Cadwallader said the vision is "for students to be able to come out of their degree with zero debt, ready to pursue the economics career of their dreams".
