In this role, you will need to apply your judgement and analytical ability to:

- Conduct compliance activities and investigate breaches of Commonwealth workplace laws and the Building Codes;
- Conduct site visits and undertake all aspects of code audits and inspections;
- Provide advice and assistance to industry participants.

You will be appointed as an Inspector under the BCIIIP Act and will be primarily responsible for auditing compliance with Commonwealth workplace laws.

You must be prepared to travel regionally and interstate for up to a number of weeks at a time for operational training or to assist in other offices. You must also hold a current driver's licence.
