



ABS Field Interviewer

Have you ever asked yourself where/how the ABS gets all their information/data from?

Our Field Interviewers are the public face of the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) and are critical in obtaining on the ground information. As an ABS Field Interviewer you will have an important role in providing accurate information to help shape your community and your family's future by building strong relationships with our household data providers and users of statistical information.

You will interview selected households to collect official statistics by conducting interviews over the phone or by visiting households, generally located within a reasonable distance from your home. You will ask survey questions and record the answers on a notebook computer. Basic computer skills are required to be able to complete the work.

The job is ideal for people who prefer working flexible hours from their home-based workplace.

As a Field Interviewer you will be expected to work a minimum of two weeks per month. Interviewers often work outside normal business hours. Availability on weekdays, weekday evenings, Saturdays and school holidays is required.

If selected, you will be required to attend a paid nine day training course commencing Monday 24 June 2019. You may be required to travel interstate to attend the training. Travel costs will be paid by the ABS.

Several positions are available in the metropolitan areas of Adelaide, Brisbane, Canberra, Darwin, Gold Coast, Hobart, Launceston, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney.
