### Position overview

The Australian National University (ANU) has an international reputation for research and education relevant to the health and well-being of the population of Australia, as well as that of the developing world. The ANU College of Health and Medicine comprises the Research School of Psychology, the ANU Medical School, the John Curtin School of Medical Research and the Research School of Population Health. These schools work together to deliver world-class research and education across the spectrum of medicine and health-related fields, working in partnership with the health sector at local, national and international levels.

Researchers in the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Program (ATSIHP) within the National Centre for Epidemiology and Population Health (NCEPH), Research School of Population Health (RSPH) conduct cutting-edge innovative and multidisciplinary large-scale research in areas across the social and cultural determinants of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health and wellbeing. We have a range of research projects that work with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities. Our approach across the program is to conduct research in partnership with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander individuals, communities, and organisations, and to frame our work using a strengths-based approach, where possible. Research areas include: the relationship between culture and wellbeing; cardiovascular disease; family and community safety; tobacco control; social and emotional wellbeing; and research methodology.

The Fellow will oversee a program of work aimed at quantifying the impact and outcomes of the Tackling Indigenous Smoking (TIS) Regional Tobacco Control Grants on smoking prevalence and other tobacco-related indicators among Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. This position reports to the Program Leader of ATSIHP and they will also regularly engage with academic and professional staff in the program, as well as a wide range of people across RSPH, the university and external stakeholders.
