The National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA), administering the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) roll-out is partnering with the Brotherhood of St Laurence to deliver services in North East Melbourne Area, Hume Moreland Area and Bayside Peninsula Area.

Key management roles in delivering disability services in your local community

Area Manager LAC

- Lead a team empowering people with disability
- Ongoing position based across North East Melbourne Area (NEMA) & Hume Moreland (HMA)

The Area manager is responsible for the oversight and delivery of NDIS Local Area Coordination services in a contracted area. This position is responsible for ensuring that:

- contractual and organizational KPIs are met (including client satisfaction)
- high levels of customer service are provided and resolving any issues that arise
- processes are implemented and continuously improved so that services are delivered to the required quality standard; and
- building and leading a team of highly effective senior managers and coordinators to deliver services to participants.

The Area Manager is also responsible for overseeing the development and strengthening of community, business and disability sector relationships and will contribute to the development of the Brotherhood's understanding of and approach to ensuring that people with disability are included at all levels in the Australian society.

LAC is pivotal in the NDIS which provides planning coordination and capacity building support for people with disability to maximise their choice and control over the services they receive. This also supports people with disability to access mainstream services and to increase our community's capacity to be accessible to people with disability.

This position will support the Area Manager in ensuring contractual and organizational KPIs are met (including client satisfaction), processes are implemented and continuously improved so that services are delivered to the required quality standard and that the LAC workforce is built and developed as a focused and highly effective team.

The Senior Manager LAC contributes to strengthening community, business and disability sector relationships and will contribute to the development of the Brotherhood's understanding of and approach to ensuring that people with disability are including at all levels in an Australian society.

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Linkage Coordinator

Linkage Coordinators assist people with disability to connect with supports and peer networks that facilitate living an ordinary life. This includes pre-planning support and implementation of NDIS plans to receive reasonable and necessary supports. Linkage Coordinators build community capacity and assist people with disability to access mainstream services regardless of NDIS eligibility.

Linkage Coordinators work in communities to strengthen the capacity of people with disability, their families and/or carers to develop their network connections and build their leadership skills and resources. Key Activities will include: development, delivery and facilitation of workshops, development and maintenance of peer support groups and networks, individual and community capacity building training and resource development.

Linkage Coordinators will also showcase good practice and build relationships with community, mainstream services and stakeholders working with people with disability. This position will assist in identifying where new local resources are required or where existing resources could be better distributed through facilitated networks and feedback.

This is an outstanding opportunity at the centre of some of the biggest changes in the disability sector in Australia's history. People with a lived experience of disability, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.
