About the role:

You will be responsible for the implementation of the Bunuba Healthy Country Plan by working with the Bunuba Dawangarri Aboriginal Corporation, Bunuba Rangers, Bunuba Country Culture Committee, and Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions and other **stakeholders with interest in the Bunuba Native Title Area.**

- Commitment and passion for nature conservation and the objectives and values of Bush Heritage;
- Demonstrated project management skills and experience in managing, people, budgets and consultants in a complex work environment;
- Demonstrated understanding and experience in working with Indigenous peoples and representative corporations, the pastoral sector and other landholders, and the development and maintenance of relationships with these stakeholders;
- Highly developed management, leadership, networking and influencing capability with demonstrated experience in recruiting, leading and managing individuals and teams;
- Highly advanced emotional competence with excellent interpersonal and influencing skills, and demonstrated success in working effectively with a diverse range of people;
- Knowledge of Health, Safety and Environment and risk assessment procedures and requirements, with demonstrated experience operating in remote outback environments; and
- Demonstrated practicable skills to assist with leading and communication with BDAC, DBCA and other primary stakeholders.
