This is an exceptional opportunity to make a very real contribution to the protection of Australia's unique wildlife and their habitat.

Bush Heritage Australia is a national leader in landscape-scale conservation. Independent and evidence-based, we work where we are needed most: in areas of high conservation value with low levels of protection. We protect and help manage 6.2 million hectares of land, providing habitat for over 5800 native species, including at least 235 threatened species. We have two proven approaches to what we do: we carefully select, purchase and manage landscapes of high conservation value; and we work in partnership with others, including Traditional Owners, to achieve conservation outcomes.

Bon Bon Station Reserve is a former sheep property in the Kingoonya District of South Australia. Our vision is to effectively manage the natural and cultural values of Bon Bon in this unique arid environment whilst contributing to the overall health and resilience of the broader Kingoonya landscape and community.

About the role:

This important role is responsible for supporting the operations of property management and community engagement at Bon Bon Station Reserve. The position will receive direction from the property manager and work closely with other key staff within Bush Heritage, including the Bon Bon Project Officer, the SA Arid Rangelands Ecologist and the Healthy Landscapes Manager SA/VIC. This role is a fantastic training and career development opportunity for the right person. This role is not permanently based on Bon Bon Station, however Bush Heritage will provide basic furnished accommodation for this position whilst onsite. Your home location is negotiable, however ideally located in the SA Arid Lands.

What you'll need to succeed:

- Commitment and passion for nature conservation, caring for country and the objectives and values of Bush Heritage;
- Demonstrated understanding and experience in working with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, pastoral communities, and the development and maintenance of relationships with these communities;
- Certificate level or higher qualification in Cultural and/or Natural Resource Management or equivalent work experience;
- Experience working and living in a remote environment along with practical workshop skills including repairs and maintenance; and
- Experience in operating and recovering 4WD vehicles in a variety of conditions and a full South Australian driver's license.
