You will liaise with Council and local Elders and community members, working towards common goals that value culture and heritage and improve outcomes for Aboriginal people.

As the Aboriginal Youth & Community Development Officer your key responsibilities will include:

- Creating, supporting, managing and delivering innovative capacity building projects, events and programs in line with City of Wagga Wagga Community Strategic Plan, our Reconciliation Action plan and identified Aboriginal community need;
