We are looking for a creative and passionate male worker with excellent values and principles and a clear understanding in regards to the dynamics surrounding Family Violence to fit into our small team who will help to:

- Reduce the impact of family violence & trauma
- Empower Indigenous men & families to live free from violence
- Co-facilitate Men's Behaviour Change Programs for Men who have committed violence against women and their children.
- Case manage individual men to address family violence any underlying issues they have in their lives that is impacting on their own lives as well as their partners and children and family.
- Providing educational and therapeutic programs with children and youth.
- Assist men with their healing journey

Boorndawan Willam Aboriginal Healing Service (BWAHS) is one of four Aboriginal specific Family Violence Healing Services across the state funded by the Department of Health and Human Services. We have been under the auspice of EACH since 2006 and are currently becoming independent of the auspice arrangement.

BWAHS is committed to playing an essential role in developing programs and services that respond to Aboriginal families in the EMR who have been impacted by family violence. BWAHS is actively involved with the EMR Indigenous Family Violence Regional Action Group and is involved with a number of organizations and networks. The Men's Family Violence & Healing Support Worker will play an integral role with Aboriginal men and/or partners of Aboriginal women who use violence.

This is an excellent opportunity to facilitate the healing journey for Aboriginal men, youth and families helping them stabilize their lives, and address any issues of Family Violence and reconnect to Aboriginal culture, community and family. This role involves providing holistic support and advocacy within an Aboriginal framework by coordinating a range of services to meet diverse needs. You will collaborate with other agencies who work with Aboriginal men, children, youth and families and facilitate and co facilitate Men's Family Violence Behaviour Change Programs.

Experience in the family violence sector or related area; you will have an excellent understanding of Aboriginal culture and intergenerational trauma, particularly of family violence in the Aboriginal Men's context. You are able to interact effectively with Aboriginal men, provide appropriate services and contribute to culturally specific designed group programs. Experience in individual casework and group programs are beneficial.
