The Boorndawan Willam Aboriginal Healing Service (BWAHS) is seeking a person who has a good understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures and society, who is qualified and/or has experience working in the family violence field, to work as part of a diverse team of professionals to deliver quality care to the community in the Eastern Metropolitan Region. The case management trial program is an initiative of the Victorian State Government for the provision of case management for men who use violence. Using a strengths-based, trauma informed approach, the case manager will provide individual case management to enable men to take responsibility for their violent behaviors and address them.

The successful candidate will have demonstrated case management skills and experience working in the family violence sector. You will have a clear understanding of the dynamics of family violence in the context of contemporary Aboriginal culture and the history of intergenerational trauma.
