About Griffith University

The Doctor of Medicine (MD) is a School of Medicine flagship postgraduate program, which prepares highly able graduates for practice and further training as a medical practitioner. Entry to the MD program is highly competitive. The final two years of the four-year program are principally undertaken as facilitated experiential learning in clinical settings. The MD is delivered at the Gold Coast campus (~180 students per year) and from this year, at the Sunshine Coast (50 students). Currently, 16 First People are enrolled in the MD.

Within the Health Group, of which the School of Medicine forms part, the First Peoples Health Unit provides high-level leadership and strategic direction on First People's health in the areas of learning and teaching, research and engagement.

The opportunity

The successful applicant will lead a dedicated team embedding First Peoples perspectives and knowledges across the School of Medicine to enhance curriculum content, research and engagement both internally and externally to Griffith University. The position holds specific responsibility for the development and implementation of high-quality teaching and assessment in First Peoples health in the Griffith medical program and other programs in the School of Medicine.

To perform this role, it is essential that the person who holds the position be an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person. It is therefore a genuine occupational requirement, under section 25 of the Anti-Discrimination Act 1991, that applicants are Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people.

These are continuing, full time positions based at the Gold Coast campus with travel to the Sunshine Coast campus.

About you

The successful candidate will have postgraduate qualifications in health or education at a Masters level or higher. The successful appointee will also have clinical experience as a medical practitioner in the field of First Peoples Health, or in a discipline that is highly relevant to the health needs of First Peoples. Intimate knowledge of the culture and traditions of First Peoples in Australia with a well-

recognised connection to and engagement with Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander communities.
