



Social and Emotional Wellbeing Counsellor

Kinchela Boys Home Aboriginal Corporation (KBHAC) is a not-for-profit survivor led Aboriginal community controlled organisation established to help restore and reconstruct the identity, dignity and integrity of Aboriginal men who were forcibly removed from their families and put into the Kinchela Boys Home (KBH) and to address the intergenerational trauma that adversely impacts on the lives of the men's families and descendants.

KBHAC is funded to offer Social and Emotional Wellbeing (SEWB) support to KBH survivors, their families and descendants. We are looking for a passionate individual to join our team as the SEWB Counsellor. In this role you will provide counselling and support to KBH survivors and KBHAC members who have been affected by forced removal or its intergenerational impacts. Some travel across Sydney and NSW will be a requirement of this position.

The SEWB Counsellor is responsible for:

- Providing counselling services and referrals to other supports where required
- Positive relationships within KBHAC teams, with the KBH survivors and their families and descendants and other external stakeholders
- Understanding and applying a healing-centred and trauma informed approach to all KBHAC activities
- Supporting and implementing the principles of a survivor-led organisation through engagement and a case management approach
- Promotion and community education activities and events to raise awareness of SEWB issues
- Administrative and reporting functions as directed

KBHAC offers a flexible, supportive and friendly work environment and an attractive remuneration package including salary packaging options.

The position is a full-time role (38 hours per week).
