The Museum of Contemporary art (MCA) is currently recruiting for more casual Artist Educators.

We are looking for people who have an artistic, creative or cultural practice, who are passionate about contemporary art and ideas, and who have a genuine desire to facilitate rich creative learning experiences for all audiences through a dynamic and meaningful engagement with contemporary art.

The role of Artist Educator is key to the enactment of the MCA's Creative Learning Manifesto, the ideas and values which inform our practice and the experience of learning programs at the MCA. We believe that artists model the essential ingredients for creative learning – imagination, experimentation, risk-taking, creative and critical thinking, play. Artists are people who can help us see and think in new ways.

Artist Educators sit within the Student & Teacher Engagement team of the MCA's Audience Engagement division and report to the Manager, Student & Teacher Engagement.

The practice of Artist Educators is informed by the MCA's Creative Learning Manifesto and Indigenous Cultural Learning Framework. Artist Educators have a core responsibility for the development and delivery of creative learning programs for students and teachers across our key program areas: Early Learning; Schools; Tertiary; Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander learning programs; Digital Learning and the Bella Program for audiences with disability and access requirements. Artist Educators also have the opportunity to provide learning experiences across other audience strands within Audience Engagement: Public Programs; Access Programs; Kids & Families and Young Creatives.

General responsibilities include the development and delivery of creative learning programs, incorporating gallery experiences and studio-sessions, in response to the MCA's Collection and exhibitions program.

Our expectations are that Artist Educators are available to deliver at least four programs a month, with a core responsibility to school programs. We are committed to providing ongoing training and professional development support through curatorial walkthroughs of new exhibitions, research and preparation allowances and regular team training. As Artist Educators maintain a practice outside the MCA, we understand that external projects, residences and travel opportunities will sometimes require time away.
