This role will also lead development of a NSW Health Aboriginal Health Governance and Accountability Framework and support a cultural safety agenda across NSW Health organisations. These activities are integral to the Centre's vision of health equity for Aboriginal people in NSW.

Where you'll be working

The Centre for Aboriginal Health is part of the Population and Public Health Division in the NSW Ministry of Health. The Centre is currently located in North Sydney and will be relocating to St Leonards in May 2019 when the Ministry moves toward a more contemporary working model with flexible working arrangements. The Centre for Aboriginal Health is a busy and dynamic team that is innovative and collaborative in its approach to improving health for Aboriginal people.
