Nunkuwarrin Yunti works to promote and deliver improvement in the health and well-being of all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) people in the greater metropolitan area of Adelaide and to advance their social, cultural and economic status. The Organisation places a strong focus on a client centred approach to the delivery of services and a collaborative working culture to achieve the best outcomes for our clients.

### **The Program**

Nunkuwarrin Yunti's Link-Up Program aims to support and unite Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander individuals and families who were separated under Australia's past government policies and practices including people identified as Stolen Generations, adopted, fostered or institutionalised. The Link-Up team provides culturally appropriate services including family history research and tracing, reunification and counselling, as well as promoting community awareness on the impacts of forced removals.

**Nunkuwarrin Yunti are seeking a Community Engagement Worker to join the Link-Up SA team based in Adelaide CBD, 0.5 FTE part-time.**

### **The Opportunity**

As the Link-Up Community Engagement Worker you will be primarily responsible for increasing the public and professional awareness of the impact of past Government policies and practices of removing Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander peoples from their families & communities. You will also develop service networks to ensure the delivery of culturally safe and competent support services to members of the Stolen Generations, their families and communities living in South Australia.

### **About You**

Critical to success will be:

- qualifications in a relevant area such as community development, marketing & promotion, or communication & media as well as vocational experience.
- an understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander issues, as well as those issues relating to individuals who have been removed from their families and communities, either through forcible removal and institutionalisation, fostering, and/or adoption.
- strong time management skills, with the ability to set priorities, plan and organise your own work to achieve project outcomes.
- experience in public speaking engagements and presentations.

This position requires some out-of-hours work, and travel throughout Australia to deliver community promotion activities.

It is a requirement of the role that successful candidates have a current driver's license and National Police Clearance prior to employment.
