- Assist and support the development of training and accreditation plans
- Support the development of active evaluation processes

The Person

Required or desired skills to perform the role are:

Required:

- To perform this role, it is essential that the person who holds the position be an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person. It is therefore a genuine occupational requirement under section 25 of the Anti-Discrimination Act 1991 that applicants are Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islanders. - A degree in public or human services (psychology, public health, health education, social work, social and behavioural sciences) is desirable or relevant demonstrated experience will be considered.
