The position reports to Professor Megan Davis and Professor George Williams and has no direct reports.

Specific responsibilities for this role include:

- Supporting and developing research initiatives in relation to public law and Indigenous legal issues as part of the project 'Recognition after Uluru: what next for First Nations'.
- Conducting literature reviews and analysis and contribute to high quality academic and legal profession publications.
- Preparing draft applications for submission to external research grant schemes.
- Preparing reports, presentations, posters and manuscripts for an expert audience and peer review.
- Disseminate research findings in newsletters, referred academic publications, reports, submissions and conference papers.
- Teaching may be required in the area of the research project.

Specific requirements include:

- A PhD in law or near completed.
- Interest or experience in Indigenous peoples and the law and/or First Nations law reform.
- Demonstrated ability to undertake independent research on the specific project.
- Proven ability to write reports, tenders and grant applications.
- Demonstrated capacity to collaborate with academics, legal practitioners and others and build and maintain effective relationships.
