The Centre for the Advancement of Indigenous Knowledges (CAIK) is seeking to recruit an Indigenous Postdoctoral Research Fellow.

The Centre for the Advancement of Indigenous Knowledges (CAIK) is an Indigenous academic centre of expertise at the University of Technology Sydney. CAIK was established in 2015, with a core business focus on the implementation of Indigenous Graduate Attributes. It currently houses three senior Indigenous academics, one administrator and ten Higher Degree Research (HDR) students.

As the Indigenous Postdoctoral Fellow, you will be required to conduct significant work on an Australian Research Council (ARC).

Specifically, you will:

- Play a key role in the Walan Mayiny grant – including the collection of data, analysis and dissemination of findings (e.g. through publications and presentations).
- Apply for external grant funding
- Attend regular committee and staff meetings
- Publish in appropriate scholarly journals and books
- Present at conferences and at internal or other seminars and events
- Contribute guest lectures, where appropriate
- Contribute to research degree supervision, where appropriate

As this is an identified role pursuant to the exemption granted to UTS under s126 of the Anti-Discrimination Act 1977 (NSW), we will only consider applications for this position from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander* candidates.

- A doctoral qualification in a relevant discipline (e.g. Education, Indigenous Studies or other Humanities discipline).
- Knowledge of ethical research practices when working with Indigenous people and communities.

As the successful applicant, you will be appointed to the Centre for the Advancement of Indigenous

Knowledges which is positioned in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences.
