## The Aboriginal Allied Health Cadetships offer the cadets:

- A study allowance of \$600 per fortnight (minus tax) commencing at the beginning of each academic year, for a maximum of up to 40 weeks. Cadets also receive \$500 each semester for books and equipment
- A work placement of up to 12 weeks in paid employment in an allied health role in a local public health facility
- The opportunity to consolidate theoretical knowledge and to practise clinical skills in a public health facility during a work placement period
- The opportunity to work in a local public health facility while completing allied health studies
- An income while studying
- Support and mentoring by professionals - both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal - already working within health settings
- The opportunity to develop both cultural and allied health links
- Clinical support and mentoring
- Potential for ongoing employment once graduated
