The Kulbardi Aboriginal Centre is responsible for the support of Murdoch University's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. The Centre provides access programs for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to undertake university studies. It is also responsible for the implementation of recruitment and retention strategies that seek to improve educational outcomes for Indigenous people and their communities. The Centre is also developing a research profile that is responsive to the needs and aspirations of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and communities.

The Role

This position is required to support the Kulbardi Aboriginal Centre with the research, publication and dissemination activities relating to the impact of curriculum, learning and teaching interventions and academic support/success initiatives coordinated by the Centre. Furthermore, this position will also be responsible for assisting with the Centre's "Transformative Learning at the Cultural Interface" project that is currently underway. While this is a short-term project appointment it is anticipated that it will lead to further opportunities.

Skills and Experience

- Be an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander who self identifies, is accepted by the community and is of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent.
- Have a, or evidence of near-completion of a PhD in education, psychology, Indigenous studies or other discipline relevant to the position purpose.
- Demonstrated ability to work under broad direction only, exercise initiative in undertaking responsibilities and work effectively as a team member to achieve significant outcomes.
- Demonstrated ability to engage in high quality independent research.
- Well-developed interpersonal skills and the ability to work effectively as a member of an interdisciplinary and collegial team.
- Demonstrated high levels of written and oral communication skills in English.
- Have a respect for the diversity within Indigeneity and its multiple expressions and understand why inclusivity is important to the work that an Indigenous centre does within a university.
