### About the role

Sheriff's Aboriginal Liaison Officers (SALOs) work to deliver sound advice between the Aboriginal community and the Sheriff's Office.

SALOs assist in establishing and coordinating services to help Aboriginal community members address their outstanding infringement obligations. As a SALO, you will participate in community building and engagement activities to develop awareness towards Sheriff's duties.

As a SALO, your key duties will include:

- developing community awareness towards Sheriff's officers and their duties
- providing advice, referral and practical assistance to the Aboriginal community and individual community members about how to resolve outstanding infringement matters
- having an understanding of Aboriginal issues and the needs of Aboriginal offenders, and communicating this back to the regional office
- establishing effective communication networks between Sheriff's officers, local Aboriginal community members and other government and non-government agencies.

The role is based in Sunshine, but you will also be required to travel regularly across Melbourne's western suburbs in order to service your client group.

### About you

To be successful in this role, you will need to possess a good understanding of the Victorian Aboriginal community, with the ability to communicate sensitively and effectively with its members.

Previous experience in case management to assist complex individuals in reaching positive outcomes is also highly desirable.
