

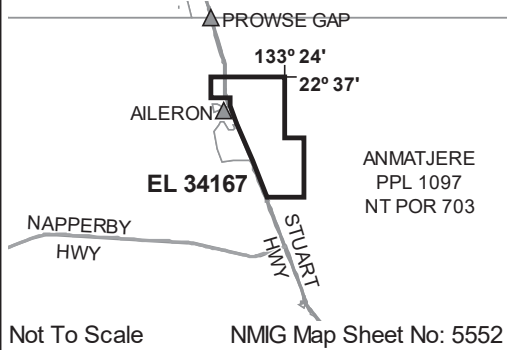

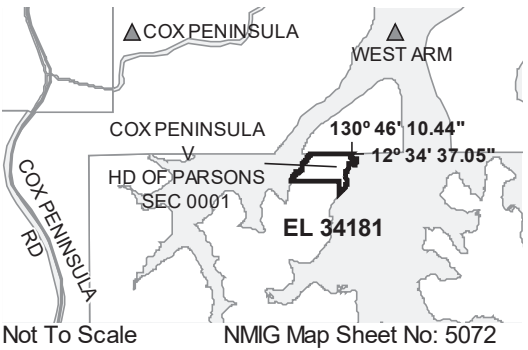
The Honourable Gerard Maley MLA, the Northern Territory Minister for Mining and Energy, C/- Department of Mining and Energy, GPO Box 4550 DARWIN NT 0801, hereby gives notice in accordance with section 29 of the *Native Title Act 1993* (Commonwealth) of his intent to do an act, namely to grant the following exploration licence applications.

Applications to which this notice applies:

Exploration Licence 34167 sought by GEMPART (NT) PTY LTD, ACN 081 859 896 over an area of 20 Blocks (55 km²) depicted below for a term of 6 years, within the AILERON locality.



Exploration Licence 34181 sought by NT LITHIUM PTY LTD, ACN 659 411 926 over an area of 3 Blocks (1 km²) depicted below for a term of 6 years, within the BYNOE locality.



Nature of act(s): The grant of an exploration licence under the *Mineral Titles Act 2010* authorises the holder to conduct activities in connection with exploration for minerals for a term not exceeding 6 years and to seek renewal(s). The term for which it is intended to grant the mineral exploration licences referred to in this notice commences from the date of grant. Further information about the act may be obtained from the Department of Mining and Energy, GPO Box 4550 Darwin NT 0801 or Centrepoin Building 48-50 Smith Street Darwin NT 0800, telephone (08) 8999 5322.

Native Title Parties: Any person who is, or becomes a "native title party" within the meaning of the *Native Title Act 1993* is entitled to the negotiation and/or procedural rights provided in Part 2, Division 3, Subdivision P of the *Native Title Act 1993*. Under section 30 of the *Native Title Act 1993*, persons have until 3 months after the notification day to take certain steps to become native title parties in relation to this notice. Enquiries concerning becoming a native title party should be directed to the National Native Title Tribunal, GPO Box 9973, Brisbane QLD 4001, or telephone (07) 3307 5000.

Expedited Procedure: The Northern Territory Government considers that the acts are acts attracting the expedited procedure as defined in section 237 of the *Native Title Act 1993*. The exploration licences referred to in this notice may be granted unless an objection is made by a native title party to the statement that the act is one which attracts the expedited procedure. Such an objection must be made to the National Native Title Tribunal within 4 months of the notification day.

AUTHORISATION MEETING: Saturday 29 November 2025

GunaiKurnai native title holders, as described in this notice and recognised by the Federal Court of Australia on 22 October 2010 in Mullett on behalf of the Gunai/Kurnai People v State of Victoria [2010] FCA 1144 (Mullett Determination), are invited to attend a full group authorisation meeting on the time and date below.

The purpose of the meeting is to decide whether to authorise (agree to) the GunaiKurnai Land and Waters Aboriginal Corporation (GLaWAC) entering into a variation of the existing Recognition and Settlement Agreement (RSA) under the Traditional Owner Settlement Act 2010 (Vic) and an associated Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA) under the Native Title Act 1993.

The purpose of the ILUA is to agree how rights to take and use natural resources — such as rights to hunt, fish and collect firewood — provided under a Natural Resource Agreement and Traditional Owner Land Natural Resource Agreement (forming part of the revised RSA) will affect the GunaiKurnai People's existing native title rights, as recognised in the Mullett Determination.

The proposed decisions to be made are:

1. AGREE the GunaiKurnai native title group decision-making process for making decisions at the meeting.
2. AUTHORISE GLaWAC to enter into the RSA and ILUA.

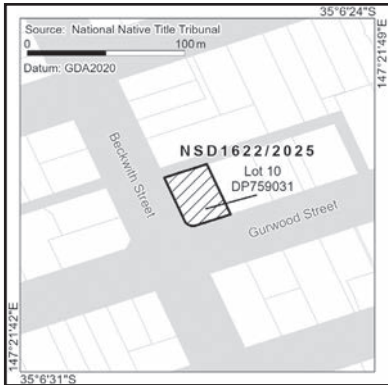
National Native Title Tribunal

A 'non-claimant' application has been made to the Federal Court of Australia (Federal Court) seeking a determination that native title does not exist in the area described below. The Applicant has a non-native title interest in the area, which is set out in their application and summarised below.

Under the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth), there can be only one determination of native title for an area. Unless there is a relevant native title claim, as defined in section 24FE, over the area described below on or before **18 February 2026**, the area may be subject to protection under section 24FA and **acts may be done which extinguish or otherwise affect native title**.

A person who claims to hold native title rights and interests in this area may wish to file a native title claimant application or become a party to this non-claimant application. These may be the only opportunities to have those rights and interests taken into account in the Federal Court's determination. Any other person may also wish to become a party.

If you want to become a party to this application, you must file a Form 5 (Notice of Intention to become a Party) with the Federal Court, **on or before 18 February 2026**. Further information regarding how to file a Form 5 is available from www.fedcourt.gov.au. After **18 February 2026**, you will need to seek leave from the Federal Court to become a party.

AUTHORISATION MEETINGS

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THESE MEETINGS?

These meetings are being held for three reasons:

- (1) Firstly, to **consider** and **authorise** whether to retain or remove two Apical Ancestors (Charlie Fourmile and Walter Fourmile) from the Claim Group Description for the Djabugay Nation native title claim;
- (2) Secondly, to **consider** and **authorise** whether to include a particular Apical Ancestor (Winmai (the mother of Mick Sheppard)) in the Claim Group Description for the Djabugay Nation native title claim; and
- (3) Thirdly, to **consider** and **authorise** whether to remove particular Apical Ancestors (Robert Clarke and Jinny the mother of Tambo Banning) and to replace them with different Apical Ancestors from the same family line.

Authorisation meetings

The authorisation meetings to be held on 24 November 2025 will be for the Djabugay Nation Claim Group, being the Djabugay, Bulway, Yirrganydji, Nyakali and Guluy peoples, to consider, and if the Claim Group decides to do so, to authorise the changes to the Claim Group Description.

Changes to a Claim Group Description must be **authorised** at a properly notified authorisation meeting.

If a Claim Group Description is changed, the Claim Group before the change must first meet and authorise the change. The changed Claim Group must then meet to authorise the claim and to authorise the Applicant, or a different Applicant, to proceed with the native title claim. That is why two meetings are being held on 24 November 2025.

Authorisation Meeting #1 will be about authorising changes to and/or confirmation of the Claim Group Description.

Authorisation Meeting #2 will be about confirming the Applicant and the lawyers. Authorisation Meeting #2 will only be held if the Claim Group authorises any of the proposed changes to the Claim Group Description at Authorisation Meeting #1.

3. Consider, and if the Claim Group decides to do so, authorise the following changes to the Claim Group Description:
 - a. Add the Apical Ancestor "Winmai";
 - b. Remove the Apical Ancestor "Robert Clarke", and include in the Claim Group Description in his place, "Kitty, the mother of Robert Clarke" and "Rosie, the mother of Lizzie Clarke nee Street"; and
 - c. Remove the Apical Ancestor "Jinny (mother of Tambo Banning)", and include in the Claim Group Description, in her place, "The unnamed father of Tambo Banning and Jack Banning".

AUTHORISATION MEETING #2

Authorisation Meeting #2 will only be held if the Claim Group authorises all or some of the proposed changes to the Claim Group Description at Authorisation Meeting #1.

If any proposed changes are made at Authorisation Meeting #1, then the biological or adoptive descendants (in accordance with traditional laws and customs) of the list of apical ancestors above, as well as the proposed additional or changed apical ancestors, are invited to attend Authorisation Meeting #2. The proposed additional or changed ancestors are as follows.

- Kitty, the mother of Robert Clarke;
- Rosie, the mother of Lizzie Clarke nee Street;
- The unnamed father of Tambo Banning and Jack Banning;
- Winmai.

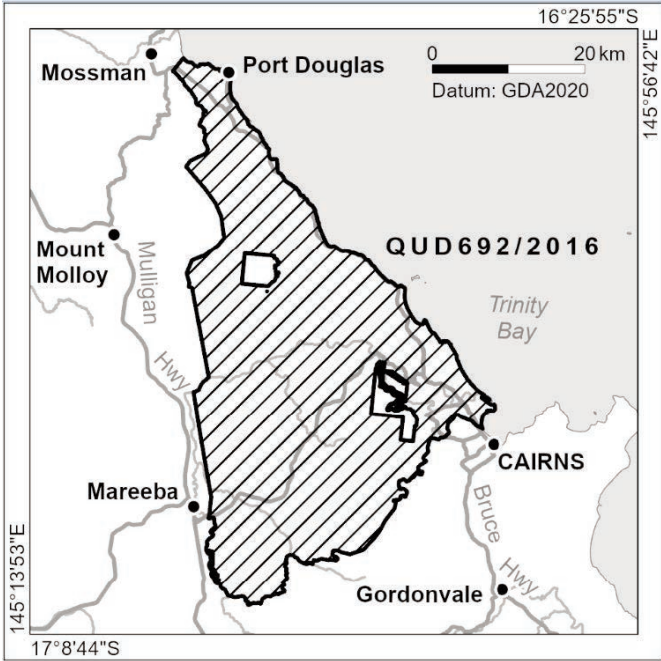
Though we invite all descendants of the 53 numbered ancestors above, along with the four proposed additional or changed ancestors above to be present, only those descendants of the ancestors in the Claim Group Description as amended at Authorisation Meeting #1 will be able to participate and vote in Authorisation Meeting #2. The formal changes made at Authorisation Meeting #1 will be announced at the commencement of Authorisation Meeting #2.

The agenda items for Authorisation Meeting #2 are as follows:

1. Confirm the decision making process to be used for making decisions at the meeting.
2. Confirm the Authorisation of the current Applicant, or if the Claim Group decides to, authorise a new Applicant, and to provide authority to prosecute the claim and deal with all matters arising in relation to it and confirm the conditions on the authority of the Applicant.
3. Authorise the Applicant to give instructions for the NQLC to act as the legal representative of the Applicant and the claim group, to do all things necessary:
 - a. to make changes to the Claim Group Description in accordance with the resolutions from Authorisation Meeting #1 on 24 November 2025; and
 - b. do all things necessary pursuant to the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth) to progress the application to a determination of native title.

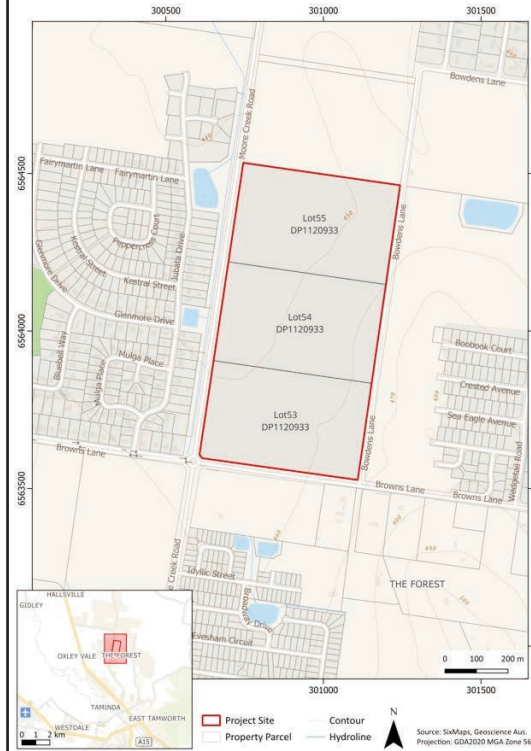


Figure 1: Plan Showing Project Site

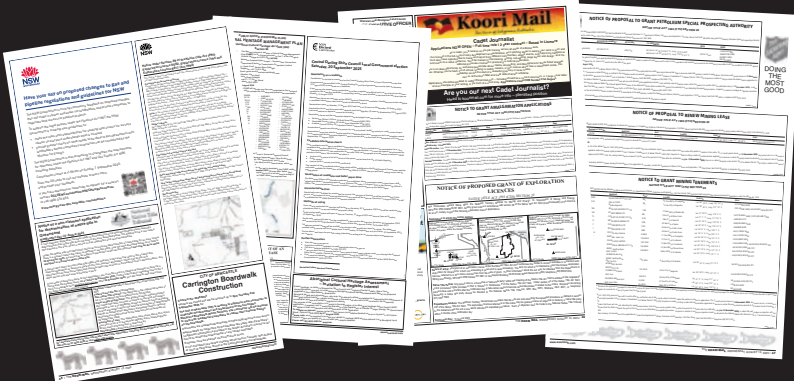
