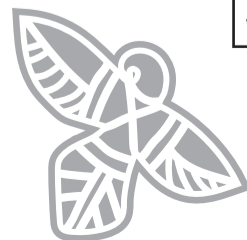

- A copy of your transcript/s showing grading scheme, GPA and all thesis and research units
