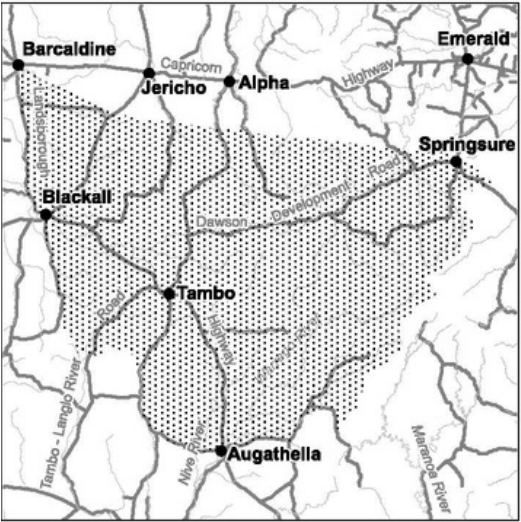

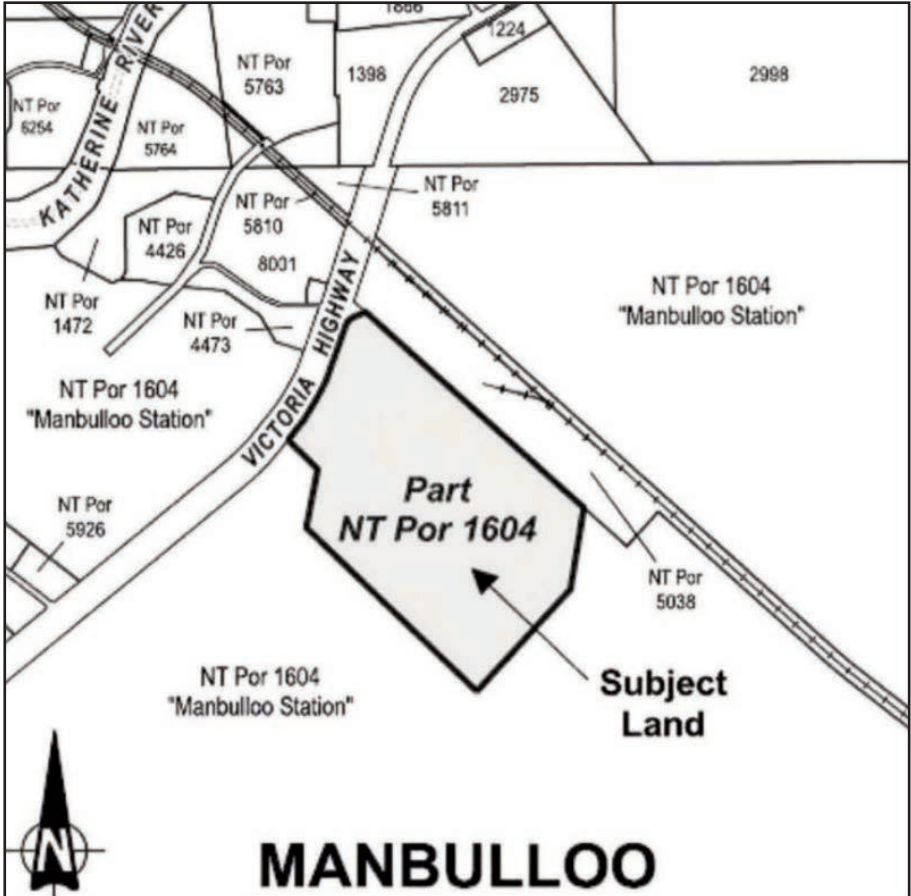

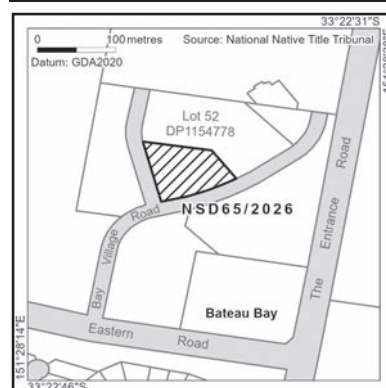

The Minister administering the Mining Act 1992 intends to grant a mining lease under section 63(1)(a) of the Mining Act 1992 (NSW) on land subject to native title.
