1. Approve a draft of the proposed s 87A Orders to be made by the Court recognising Wongkumara People’s native title rights and interests in Part A and Part B of the Wongkumara claim area as shown on the map.
2. Authorise the nomination of the Wangkumarra Kawalanyi Aboriginal Corporation ICN 7384 (WKAC) to hold the Native Title on Trust for the Wongkumara people and to be the Registered Native Title Body Corporate (RNTBC) for those rights and interests in the proposed determination area.
3. Authorise ILUA’s with the State of NSW and the State of Queensland in respect of all or parts of the Wongkumara claim area and with Yandruwandha Yawarrawarrka Traditional Land Owners (Aboriginal Corporation) RNTBC (ICN 3840) negotiated as part of the resolution of, or relevant to, the claim.
4. Authorise the outcomes negotiated by the Wongkumara Negotiating Team with the State of NSW providing compensation for areas in NSW, within the Wongkumara determination area, where Native Title has been Extinguished, the Wongkumara Claim Authorisation Meeting will in addition be requested to
5. Authorise the s 47C agreement with the State of NSW over parcels of land where non-exclusive native title can be recognised.
6. Authorise amendments to the Wongkumara Claim Form 1 to align its terms with the proposed consent determination.
7. Authorise such changes or additions as may be needed to complete the documentation for resolution of the Wongkumara Claim by consent.





Background

The Ngemba, Ngiyampaa, Wangaaypuwan and Wayilwan People’s native title determination application (Federal Court proceeding number NSD38 of 2019) (**NNWW Claim**) was registered on 14 March 2012.

The area that is the subject of the NNWW Claim is bounded by the towns of Brewarrina, Bourke, Coonamble, Gulargambone, Warren, Nyngan, Hillston, Mossiel and Ivanhoe, approximately from the Barwon River in the north, to the Lachlan River in the south, the Castlereagh River in the east and Ivanhoe in the west.

The NNWW Claim is intended to be listed by the Federal Court of Australia for a proposed Consent Determination in June 2024.

At this NNWW Claim Group meeting to be held on Friday 19 April 2024, Sunday 21 April 2024 and Monday 22 April 2024, the NNWW Claim Group will discuss and consider:

1. Authorisation of a Section 87 Agreement and Proposed Consent Determination; and
2. Workshop on the proposed rules for the Prescribed Body Corporate (**PBC**).


On Saturday 20 April 2024, the NNWW Claim Group will be asked to discuss and consider the Brewarrina Common Indigenous Land Use Agreement.

In the afternoon of Monday 22 April 2024, a general meeting of members of the Ngemba, Ngiyampaa, Wangaaypuwan, Wayilwan Aboriginal Corporation will be held to consider a request made by the Applicant in the Ngemba, Ngiyampaa, Wangaaypuwan and Wayilwan People’s native title determination application (NSD38/2019) in relation to the Corporation becoming the registered native title body corporate when the proposed consent determination is made by the Federal Court of Australia in June 2024.

Authorisation of Section 87 Agreement and Proposed Consent Determination

At this NNWW Claim Group meeting, the NNWW Claim Group will be asked whether or not they wish to authorise the Applicant in the NNWW Claim to enter into a section 87 Agreement and Consent Determination for the recognition of NNWW People’s native title.

The area proposed to be the subject of the proposed Consent Determination includes the land and waters within the external boundary of the NNWW Claim (Federal Court Proceedings NSD38/2019) as registered and as shown in the map below.



Workshop on the proposed rules for the PBC

At the NNWW Claim Group meetings on 2 and 3 March 2024 and 24 – 26 March 2024, the NNWW Claim Group discussed and decided key parts of the proposed Rulebook for the proposed Prescribed Body Corporate.

At this meeting, the NNWW Claim Group will be asked to discuss and decide the content of the proposed Rulebook for the Prescribed Body Corporate rule book, including, importantly:

- the objectives and purpose of the future NNWW People’s PBC;
- the powers of the future NNWW People’s PBC to conduct business on behalf of NNWW People;
- ways in which the future NNWW People’s PBC can make certain decisions about the native title rights and interests of NNWW People;
- the structure of the board of directors of the future NNWW People PBC; and
- the role of a Council of Elders advisory committee in certain decisions to be made by the future NNWW People’s PBC.


