
National Native Title Tribunal

This is an application by the State of Queensland, asking the Federal Court of Australia (Federal Court) to vary a determination of native title in the area described below. The applicant seeks to vary the determination to reflect the lawful effect of compulsory acquisition of native title rights and interests in the area, correct the inaccuracies in the determination, enable certain improvement works to be undertaken, and ensure the common law holders have and retain their statutory right to compensation for the compulsory acquisition.

The applicant seeks the following variation of the determination:

- (a) Schedule 1, Index Numbers 11, 1505, 1506, 1508, 1521 and 1530, are deleted;
- (b) Schedule 1, Index Number 1772 is varied so that it provides: "Burnett River, excluding the bed and banks of the Burnett River watercourse and its tributaries between 131 kilometres AMTD (Adopted Middle Thread Distance) and 178 kilometres AMTD."
- (c) Schedule 3, Sheet 197 be amended to remove: (i) Lot 45 on Crown Plan BON1502; and (ii) that part of the bed and banks of the Burnett River watercourse and its tributaries between 131 kilometres AMTD and 178 kilometres AMTD;
- (d) Schedule 3, Sheet 203 be amended to remove: (i) Lot 44 on Crown Plan BN37319; (ii) Lot 64 on Crown Plan BN37319; (iii) Lot 2 on Survey Plan [135369]; and (iv) that part of the bed and banks of the Burnett River watercourse and its tributaries between 131 kilometres AMTD and 178 kilometres AMTD;
- (e) Schedule 3, Sheet 204 be amended to remove: (i) Lot 56 on Crown Plan 861366; and (ii) Lot 59 on Crown Plan BON 26.

If you want to become a party to this application, you must file a Form 5 (Notice of Intention to become a Party) with the Federal Court, **on or before 18 January 2023**. Purpose of ILUAs Authorisation Meeting

The purpose of the ILUAs Authorisation Meeting is to consider whether to enter into proposed agreements as follows:

The Cooloola Great Walk Ecotourism Project ILUA

1. The ILUA, if agreed, will permit:
 - (a) the grant of a lease or leases under the *Nature Conservation Act 1992* (Qld) for ecotourism-related infrastructure including cabins, communal facilities, access tracks;
 - (b) the consideration of applications for Restricted Access Areas under the *Nature Conservation (Protected Areas Management) Regulation 2017* (Qld) to restrict public access at sites at Double Island Point and Lake Poona.
 - (c) any other future acts under the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth) required for the construction, operation and maintenance of the project.
 - (d) validation of any of the above acts that are future acts related to the project and that are done in the ILUA Area after execution, but prior to registration, of the ILUA.
2. Consider whether to enter into commercial agreements with the tourism project operator.
3. Consider whether to enter into a Cultural Heritage Management Agreement.

The Scarborough USL Surrender ILUA

1. The ILUA, if agreed, will permit the surrender of native title rights and interests over three parcels of land adjacent to freehold land at 28A-30 Fortune Street, Scarborough, Qld in exchange for the payment of compensation.





Background

The area that is the subject of the South Coast Claim is bounded by Port Hacking in the north, the Towamba River in the south and includes the coastal lands and waters between those rivers, west to the eastern edge of the Southern Highlands and east three nautical miles into the Pacific Ocean.

The Applicant in the South Coast Claim ('current Applicant') comprises the following persons:

The current Applicant was authorised to act on behalf of the South Coast Claim Group at a meeting held in Nowra on 26-27 February 2019.

Background - Consideration of whether to authorise the Applicant to enter into agreements with Sapphire Resources Pty Ltd, Cornfields Pty Ltd, Syndicate Minerals Pty Ltd, Wayne Perry and the Minister for Regional NSW in relation to three mineral exploration licences and one mineral exploration licence application in the South Coast Claim area.

Sapphire Resources Pty Ltd, Syndicate Minerals Pty Ltd and Wayne Perry hold mineral exploration licences in the South Coast Claim area and require the consent of the Minister for Regional New South Wales before undertaking exploration activities in certain parts of their licence areas. Cornfields Pty Ltd has applied for a mineral exploration licence which has not yet been granted. Because of the South Coast Claim, the South Coast Applicant, on behalf of the South Coast Claim Group, have the right to negotiate with all these explorers before they can be granted access to undertake exploration activities.

The current Applicant has negotiated draft Land Access Agreements and draft agreements pursuant to s31 of the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth) (*s31 Agreement*) in relation to each of the exploration licences and the exploration licence application. The meeting will discuss the right to negotiate under the Native Title Act, the background to each exploration licence and exploration licence application and the terms of the negotiated draft agreements.

The Claim Group will then discuss each of the agreements and make decisions about whether to authorise the Applicant to enter into the Land Access Agreements with the companies to undertake exploration activities over the claim area and s31 Agreements. The exploration licences and exploration licence application are:

1. Sapphire Resources Pty Ltd - exploration licence 8508 over parts of Gnupa State Forest and Yurammie State Conservation Area around Wolumla;
2. Cornfields Pty Ltd – exploration licence application 5727 over parts of Dampier State Forest;
3. Wayne Perry – exploration licence 8969 in Boyne State Forest, near East Lynne; and
4. Syndicate Minerals Pty Ltd – exploration licence 8989 over parts of Mogo State Forest north of Moruya.

Background – Authorisation of New Applicant

Aileen Blackburn, Dean Kelly, Marilyn Pickalla Campbell and John Brierley have resigned as persons jointly comprising the current Applicant for the South Coast Claim.

Accordingly, at this South Coast Claim Group meeting, the South Coast Claim Group will be asked to consider and make decisions to authorise a new Applicant. This could involve:

- i. nominating and confirming 4 people to replace those who have resigned and reauthorising the 8 remaining members of the current Applicant as well as the 4 additional people to be the Applicant;
or
- ii. any new composition of South Coast Claim Group members as the South Coast Claim Group decides.





- Amending the Authorisation of the Karratjibbin People Claim in the Federal Court of Australia over the area shown in the map below.

The map of the area described below is the application that covers an area of approximately 49,762.62 square kilometres in the vicinity of Mount Jackson and Southern Cross in Western Australia



A determination of Native Title involves a decision of the Federal Court. Important things about a determination of Native Title includes that Federal Court determines

- (1) who holds Native Title, (2) what the Native Title rights are, (3) the area to which the Native Title rights apply after any determination is made, and (4) which corporation will represent the members of the determined Native Title area.


