EASTERN MAAR PEOPLES (VID21/2019) NATIVE TITLE AUTHORISATION MEETING

29 March 2023, Logans Beach Warrnambool, Logans Beach Rd, Warrnambool

Background

The Eastern Maar Peoples have made a claimant application to the Federal Court of Australia seeking recognition of their native title rights and interests under the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth) ('NTA'). The claim is called *Ivan Couzens & Ors on behalf of the Eastern Maar Peoples (VID21/2019)* ('Native Title Claim').

The native title claim area is depicted in the below map. The uncontested portions are those within the boundary shown that are not shaded and/or marked either 'A', 'B', 'C', 'D' or 'E'. The Eastern Maar Peoples native title rights and interests to the uncontested portions will be recognised by the Federal Court of Australia through a Consent Determination on 28 March 2023 at LOCATION.

This is an authorisation meeting to consider authorising an amendment to the native title claim to:

- ensure that Eastern Maar Peoples native title rights and interests can be recognised over park areas in the native title claim area. If approved, these areas, can be included in a future determination of native title.
- exclude the old Terrinallum homestead from the claim as part of a proposed settlement with the Wadawurrung claimants and respondents.

It is also proposed to ask the claim group to consider options to reach agreement with certain Indigenous respondent parties over contested areas 'A', 'B', 'D' and 'E' in the Native Title Claim area.

THIS NOTICE INVITES all members of the native title claim group as described below to attend the native title Authorisation Meeting at the date time and location below.

- Consider **AUTHORISING** amendments to Schedules B, E and L of the Form 1 to include park areas within the native title claim that can be subject to the operation of section 47C of the *Native Title Act 1993*.
- CONSIDER** amending the external boundary of the claim area to exclude the old Terrinallum homestead.

The purposes of the meeting are also for the native title claim group to:

- CONSIDER** options to reach agreement with certain Indigenous respondent parties over contested areas in the Native Title Claim area, in particular in relation to the areas marked A, B, D and E.
- PASS** any necessary Resolutions to give effect to decisions made in relation to 4, above.
- DISCUSS** Eastern Maar's selection process for a reserved seat on First Peoples' Assembly of Victoria.



NOTICE INITIATING NEGOTIATIONS WITH NATIVE TITLE PARTIES - MINING ACT 1971 (SA) SECTION 63M

Without limiting that general description, those operations may include: reconnaissance; gridding; mapping; aerial and handheld photography; airborne and ground magnetic, electromagnetic, radiometric, seismic, gravity and electrical surveying; soil and other geochemical sampling; water sampling; hydrological studies; hydrogeology surveys; shallow trenching; limited clearing for access and drilling; drilling (including diamond core drilling and other methods); downhole-probing, sampling and radiometric testing of drill core/cuttings; environmental monitoring work (including baseline work, flora/fauna surveys, geotechnical surveys) and establishment of temporary camp/storage sites and access tracks as may be necessary.

The proposed activities are (or will be) authorised by the following exploration authorities under the Mining Act 1971 (SA):

Exploration Licences 6372, 6387, 6709 and 6876 (including any extension, replacement, renewal, regrant or subsequent exploration licence granted for or other dealings with Exploration Licences 6372, 6387, 6709 and 6876, and any other exploration authority or interest in any exploration authority for the whole or any part of the Land).

The Proponent seeks to negotiate a native title mining agreement under Part 9B of the Mining Act 1971 (SA).

TAKE NOTICE that if, four (4) months after this notice is given as required by the *Mining Act 1971 (SA)*, there are no persons registered under the law of the State or the Commonwealth as the holders of, or claimants to, native title in the Land, the **Proponent** (or its successor or assign) may apply without notice to any person to the Environment, Resources and Development Court for a summary determination authorising entry to the Land for the purpose of carrying out mining operations on the Land, and the conduct of mining operations on the Land.


Native Title Parties: Any person who is, or becomes a "native title party" within the meaning of the *Native Title Act 1993* is entitled to the negotiation and/or procedural rights provided in Part 2, Division 3, Subdivision P of the *Native Title Act 1993*. Under section 30 of the *Native Title Act 1993*, persons have until 3 months after the notification day to take certain steps to become native title parties in relation to this notice. Enquiries concerning becoming a native title party should be directed to the National Native Title Tribunal, GPO Box 9973, Brisbane QLD 4001, or telephone (07) 3307 5000.

Expedited Procedure: The Northern Territory Government considers that the acts are acts attracting the expedited procedure as defined in section 237 of the *Native Title Act 1993*. The exploration licences referred to in this notice may be granted unless an objection is made by a native title party to the statement that the act is one which attracts the expedited procedure. Such an objection must be made to the National Native Title Tribunal within 4 months of the notification day.

The State of Victoria wishes to notify any interested person that it is currently considering the following minerals licence applications.

Exploration Licences (EL)

If these licences are granted, the licensees will be permitted to explore for minerals on the specified land for the term of the licence, and to apply for two renewals of up to five years.

Invitation for Consultation: Montara Project and Stag Field



Montara Project

Jadestone Energy (Jadestone) is the operator of the producing Montara Project in Australian waters, approximately 690 km west of Darwin in the Timor Sea. The Montara Project operations involve oil production using wellhead platform (WHP) wells for the Montara field, and subsea wells for the Swift, Skua and Swallow fields. The oil from the subsea wells is piped via flowlines to the unmanned WHP, and then to the Montara Venture floating production storage and offloading (FPSO) facility, which acts as a hub for the project in production since 2013.

Stag Field

Jadestone is also the operator of the producing Stag field in Australian waters and located approximately 60 km northwest of Dampier in the Indian Ocean. The Stag field was developed using a fixed leg, 12 well-slot, manned central processing facility platform in production since 1998. This is connected, by an eight-inch underwater export pipeline, to a pipeline end manifold where shuttle tankers directly load crude oil via a catenary anchor leg mooring buoy.

Environment Plans (EP)

Jadestone is updating the currently approved EPs, the Montara EP for the Montara Project, and the Stag EP for the Stag field. Each EP will govern production and maintenance activities for the next five years. The revised Montara EP and Stag EP will be assessed by the National Offshore Petroleum Safety and Environmental Management Authority for acceptance.

In addition, Jadestone is preparing an EP for the removal of three subsea wellheads at Montara that are no longer in use (the Wellhead Removal EP). This activity is tentatively planned to occur in 2023/2024.

Jadestone is also preparing an EP for the drilling activities at the Stag platform (the Stag Drilling EP). This will include new production wells from recovered well-slots and may include plugging and abandonment of other wells potentially involving wellhead removal.

The purpose of the EPs is to identify the risks and impact of each proposed petroleum activity on the environment. The EPs will also set out measures to reduce identified environmental impacts and describe how and to what level of performance

those measures will be implemented throughout each activity. Jadestone is inviting comments for consideration during the preparation of each of the EPs discussed above.



The project will ultimately allow Aboriginal people to register as Aboriginal Owners for the Kamay Botany Bay National Park and Towra Nature Reserve, under Part 9 of the *Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983* ('ALRA').

The **draft cultural area map** and **draft list of Original Aboriginal Inhabitants** ('OAIs') have been revised and expanded (based on information and feedback from community and further research). The ORALRA will also be discussing a **draft statement of cultural association** which is based on information from community members and participants, and expert anthropological advice.



The purpose of this meeting is to provide an opportunity for Wadawurrung Traditional Owners to discuss, consider and decide whether or not to consent to the Wadawurrung Applicant:

1. reducing the Wadawurrung Native Title Application area by removing the area of the application that overlaps the Eastern Maar Native Title Application area (known as Areas D and E).

1. Welcome to Country and introductions;
2. Update on the agreement in principle made with the Eastern Maar Native Title Applicant in relation to the area of overlap with the Wadawurrung Native Title Application (Areas D and E);
3. To discuss, consider and decide whether or not to consent to the Applicant reducing Wadawurrung Native Title Application Area by removing the area that overlaps the Eastern Maar Native Title Claim

Aboriginal Registration for Community Consultation—Macquarie Street East Precinct – Stage 1 Public Domain Works Project.

On behalf of Property & Development NSW (Vy Nguyen, precinctdevelopment@dpie.nsw.gov.au, the proponent), GML Heritage (GML) seeks registration from local Aboriginal groups and people with respect to the future application for an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP) under Part 6 of the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974.




Figure 1 Location of study area (Source: Property & Development NSW 2022)




Figure 2 Location of the study area with public domain works extent highlighted (Source: Property & Development NSW 2022)




