



(b) Who identify as and are recognised as members of the Kabi Kabi First Nation Traditional Owners in accordance with the system of traditional laws and customs.

On 14 June 2023 the Federal Court ordered that two persons be joined as respondents to the native title claim limited to an area in the northern part of the claim. The Tenure Resolution ILUA cannot progress to registration while it includes the 'disputed areas.'

This Notice invites all Kabi Kabi People and anyone who asserts that they hold or may hold native title in the relevant area to attend an Authorisation Meeting to consider, and if appropriate, make a decision to authorise amendments to the Tenure Resolution ILUA between the Kabi Kabi People and the State of Queensland to exclude the disputed areas.

The proposed amended area is depicted at Map 1.









Description of the nature of the act





PURPOSE OF MEETINGS

If the claims are combined, there will then be only **ONE** claim over the whole of the area of each of these claims – that is, ONE claim would cover the area within the black outline of the Djabugay Nation claim and the areas of the Yirrganydji (Irukandji) People claims highlighted in green and purple, as set out in the map.

NO DECISION has yet been made as to whether the claims will be combined. Each separate claim group will have meetings to consider whether to authorise the combination. The decision to combine the claims is solely a decision for each of the claim groups to make at their respective authorisation meetings. If the claim groups decide to combine the claims, resolutions in line with the draft agenda items below may be made at each meeting.


