

A 'non-claimant' application has been made to the Federal Court of Australia (the Federal Court) seeking a determination that native title does not exist in the area described below. The Applicant has a non-native title interest in the area, which is set out in their application and summarised below.

Under the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth), there can be only one determination of native title for an area. Unless there is a relevant native title claim, as defined in section 24FE, over the area described below on or before **5 December 2023**, the area may be subject to protection under section 24FA and **acts may be done which extinguish or otherwise affect native title**.

A person who claims to hold native title rights and interests in this area may wish to file a native title claimant application or become a party to this non-claimant application. These may be the only opportunities to have those rights and interests taken into account in the Federal Court's determination. Any other person may also wish to become a party.

If you want to become a party to this application, you must file a Form 5 (Notice of Intention to become a Party) with the Federal Court, **on or before 5 December 2023**. Further information regarding how to file a Form 5 is available from www.fedcourt.gov.au. After **5 December 2023**, you will need to seek leave from the Federal Court to become a party.

Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment – Invitation for Registrations of Interest - 763-769 Pacific Highway, Chatswood.

Artefact Heritage on behalf of Novus (the proponent) is undertaking an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report (ACHAR) for the proposed demolition and redevelopment of the existing properties at 763-769 Pacific Highway, Chatswood (Lot 6 DP2983, Lot 7 DP2983, Lot 8 DP2983 & Lot 100 DP618823), and the construction of a circa 28-storey Build-to-Rent residential building with ground floor retail uses and associated basement parking and services. 

Background

The Eastern Maar Peoples have made a claimant application to the Federal Court of Australia seeking recognition of their native title rights and interests under the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth) ('NTA'). The claim is called *Janice Austin & Ors on behalf of the Eastern Maar Peoples (VID21/2019)* ('Native Title Claim'). On 28 March 2023 the Federal Court of Australia recognised the Eastern Maar peoples native title over a large part of the Native Title Claim area. This area is outlined in purple in the below map.

This is an authorisation meeting to consider authorising:

- A determination of native title over the areas outlined in blue and labelled 'Area 1', 'Area 2' and 'Area 3' in the below map;
- The nomination of the Eastern Maar Aboriginal Corporation ('the Corporation') to represent the native title holders for these areas;
- The Corporation to make native title decisions in relation to land and waters which fall within the Eastern Maar Peoples native title areas.

A determination of native title is a decision of the Federal Court. The Court determines (1) who holds native title, (2) what the native title rights are, (3) the area to which the native title rights apply after any determination is made, and (4) which corporation will represent the native title holders. If the meeting on Friday 8 September 2023 authorises the proposed determination of native title, the determination will then be sought in the Federal Court.

The Corporation has called a meeting for the same, date, time and location to consider the approval of an agreement with Beach Energy to permit gas production from the Enterprise Project. This item will be discussed at the same meeting and further information about this item is the subject of a separate notice.



The WAC holds the native title as the agent for the Widi Common Law Native Title Holders, and has been negotiating the following agreements:

- A Cultural Heritage Management Plan, Indigenous Land Use Agreement, and Ancillary Agreement (together, the QPM Agreements) with QPM Energy Pty Ltd in relation to Queensland Pacific Metals (QPM Energy) Carbon Abatement Project (see maps below on page 3-4).

The parties have reached in principle agreement in respect of the above QPM Agreements, and in accordance with the Native Title (Prescribed Bodies Corporate) Regulations 1999 (Cth) WAC is required to conduct a consent and consultation meeting with the Widi Common Law Native Title Holders.

Purpose

The purpose of the Information Session is to:

1. CONSULT with the Widi Common Law Native Title Holders in relation to the proposed QPM Agreements;
2. CONFIRM the Widi decision making process for the making of decisions at the Decision-Making Meeting;
