

ConocoPhillips Australia Otway Exploration Drilling Program

ConocoPhillips Australia is continuing to develop an Environment Plan for the proposed offshore Otway Exploration Drilling Program that consists of seabed surveys and the drilling of up to six exploration wells in exploration permits VIC/P79 and T/49P, located in Commonwealth waters.

ConocoPhillips Australia is releasing draft Environment Plan chapters to support consultation and has extended consultation on the proposed activity until **30 September 2023**, after which time we will pause consultation so we can collate a submission to NOPSEMA for public comment and assessment. Notice under Section 29 of the Native Title Act 1993 Exploration Licence Number EL9590 (Act 1992)

This notice is given in accordance with the requirements of section 29 of the Native Title Act 1993 (Commonwealth).

Description of the nature of the act

Pursuant to the Native Title (Right to Negotiate (Exclusion) – NSW Land) Determination No. 1 of 1996 (Cth), Exploration Licence 9590 includes a condition to the effect that the holder must not prospect on any land or waters covered by the licence in relation to which native title exists without the prior written consent of the Minister administering the Mining Act 1992 (the 'Native Title Condition').

The Minister administering the Mining Act 1992 intends to give consent to prospecting on land subject to native title in the licence in accordance with the Native Title (Right to Negotiate (Inclusion) – NSW Land) Approval No. 1 of 1996 (Cth).

Should consent be granted, the licence holder may apply to renew or transfer the licence prior to it expiring (including partial renewals or partial transfers).

Note: If the consent is granted, it will apply to any renewal, re grant or re-making (including partial renewals or partial transfers) or extension of the term of the licence, which may be valid pursuant to section 24MD(1) of the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth) without a further notification under section 29.

Holder's details

Westrock Minerals Pty Ltd (ACN 625 790 187) is the holder of Exploration Licence 9590 for Group 1 minerals.

The licence contains a condition that the holder must not prospect on any land or waters on which native title exists without the prior consent of the Minister administering the Mining Act 1992. The licence holder has sought the Minister's consent to conduct prospecting activities in the entire licence area.

Description of area that may be affected

The entire area of Exploration Licence 9590 which covers about 69 units and is situated approximately 32 kilometres north of Moruya, in the State of NSW.



Background

The area that is the subject of the NNWW Claim is bounded by the towns of Brewarrina, Bourke, Coonamble, Gulgarnambone, Warren, Nyngan, Hillston, Mossiel and Ivanhoe, from the Barwon River in the north, to the Lachlan River in the south, the Castlereagh River in the east and Ivanhoe in the west.

Consideration of whether to authorise the Applicant to enter into a section 31 Deed with Stannum Pty Ltd and the Minister for Natural Resources and a Land Access Agreement with Stannum Pty Ltd

Stannum Pty Ltd ('Stannum') have applied for Minister's Consent to prospect (explore) on any land or waters on which native title has not been extinguished within Exploration Licence 6699 (which is located about 65km north-west of Condobolin and is known as the 'Tallebung Exploration Area').

Under the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth), the registered native title claimant (**NNWW Applicant**) has a right to negotiate with Stannum in relation to the grant of Minister's Consent. The NNWW Applicant does not have a right to veto the grant of Minister's Consent to prospect.

The Applicant has negotiated a draft Land Access Agreement with Stannum and a draft section 31 Deed with Stannum and the Minister for Natural Resources.

The draft Land Access Agreement includes a package of benefits in exchange for the consent of the Applicant to the grant of Minister's Consent.

At this NNWW Claim Group meeting, the NNWW Claim Group will be asked whether or not they wish to authorise the Applicant to enter into the draft Land Access Agreement with Stannum and the draft section 31 Deed with Stannum and the Minister for Natural Resources.



The WAC and GNWAC holds native title as the agent for the Widi Common Law Native Title Holders, and has been negotiating the following agreements:


- Two Exploration Permit Consent Agreements between WAC and Anglogold Ashanti Australia Limited relating to exploration permits (together, the **WAC Anglogold Agreements**). The first agreement relates to exploration permits for minerals numbered 28194, 28195, 28196, and 28200, and any future renewals of those exploration permits. The second agreement relates to exploration permit for minerals numbered 28197 and any future renewals of this exploration permit.
- An Exploration Permit Consent Agreement between GNWAC and Anglogold Ashanti Australia Limited relating to exploration permits (the **GNWAC Anglogold Agreement**). The proposed exploration permits include exploration permits for minerals numbered 28194, 28195, 28196, 28197 and 28200, and any future renewals of those exploration permits.
- A State Deed between WAC, GNWAC, AngloGold Ashanti and Barada Barna Aboriginal Corporation RNTBC in accordance with section 31(1)(b) of the Native Title Act and in relation to the WAC Anglogold Agreements and GNWAC Anglogold Agreement (the **State Deed**).
