





### Aboriginal Community Consultation

#### Aboriginal cultural heritage consultation requirements for proponents 2010

Regis Resources Ltd are conducting an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment for the proposed development of an Electricity Transmission Line (ETL) as part the McPhillamys Gold Project. The proposed ETL is approximately 16 km in length, running from McPhillamys Gold Mine, near Blayney, connecting to the existing 132 KV transmission line to the north-east. Regis Resources Ltd is seeking to consult with Aboriginal people who hold cultural knowledge relevant to determining the significance of Aboriginal objects and places in the area associated with the ETL through a process of community consultation regarding the proposed activity.

The purpose of the consultation is to assist Regis Resources Ltd in the preparation of the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment to assist the Department of Planning and Environment in their determination of the development.



## Mount Piper to Wallerawang Transmission Line Upgrade Project

### Notice and registration of Aboriginal interests

Transgrid is proposing a new 330 kilovolt (kV) electricity transmission line between Mount Piper and Wallerawang in the Lithgow Local Government Area, NSW to transmit power from renewable energy generators in the Central-West Orana Renewable Energy Zone to the Sydney basin.

The key elements of the project include:

- A new 8-kilometre, double circuit 330 kilovolt (kV) transmission line and support structures between the existing substations at Mount Piper and Wallerawang.
- Removal of some redundant wooden structures supporting the existing 132 kV transmission line within the same corridor.
- Widening the existing easement from 45 metres to 60 metres to accommodate the new 330 kV transmission line and the existing 132 kV transmission line.
- Upgrading existing access tracks and installing new tracks to provide access to the project area.
- Other ancillary works at the two substations to facilitate the project.

Transgrid and OzArk Environment & Heritage are seeking registrations of interest from Aboriginal people who hold cultural knowledge relevant to determining the significance of Aboriginal objects and/or places within the vicinity of the project. The purpose of consultation with Aboriginal people is to assist Transgrid to prepare an environmental impact assessment for the project.

Following registrations of interest, we will work with the registered Aboriginal people to determine our preferred consultation approach and assessment methodology over the coming months.



## Sea Country Consultation

Beach Energy is inviting consultation with First Nations Peoples who may have an interest in Sea Country in Beach's offshore project areas. Beach supplies the Australian east-coast gas market through production at the Otway Gas Plant near Port Campbell and the Lang Lang Gas Plant 80km south-east of the Melbourne CBD.

As Australia continues its transition to more renewable energy sources there is still demand for natural gas from homes, business and industry. To continue meeting this need, Beach has commenced planning and consultation for its Offshore Gas Victoria (OGV) Project.

### Activities and Timing

Activities will occur in existing production and exploration licenses held by Beach and will include seabed assessments (non-seismic), removing suspended wells, drilling and connecting new wells to existing pipelines. Starting from early 2024, activities will be run over different phases through to late 2026. The project and all timings are subject to final internal and regulatory approvals, vessel availability and weather conditions. There are several locations south of Port Campbell and in Bass Strait, as shown on the project maps (see QR code below).

### Environment Plans

The OGV Project will require Environment Plans to be approved by the National Offshore Petroleum Safety and Environmental Management Authority (NOPSEMA) before activities can start.

Environment Plans must include:

- a description of the proposed activities
- a description of the natural environment including the social, economic and cultural features
- evaluation of the impacts and risks
- any measures to reduce impacts and risks that were identified during consultation
- environmental performance outcomes and controls
- implementation strategy and reporting requirements
- a description of how consultation was carried out with relevant persons whose functions, interests and activities may be affected by the project activities.

An important part of developing an Environmental Plan is consulting and obtaining feedback from people with a cultural connection to Sea Country through Indigenous tradition.

### Consultation

Beach aims to conduct transparent and respectful consultations with First Nations groups, and other relevant persons.

If you consider your functions, interests or activities may be affected we would like to consult with you to understand your concerns and where possible, to explore measures to reduce any impacts and risks.

We are required to share consultation records with NOPSEMA, however you can tell us if any cultural information that you share with us is sensitive and it won't be published in the Environment Plan.




## Relevant Person Consultation:

### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO A NATIONAL HERITAGE LISTING: WAVE HILL WALK OFF ROUTE

## CALL FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

The Australian Heritage Council is proposing amendments to the **Wave Hill Walk Off Route** National Heritage listing to correct factual errors in the listing. The National Heritage List recognises places that are of outstanding significance to the nation for their natural, Indigenous and/or historic heritage values.

The Australian Heritage Council, on community advice, proposes to change the date of the Walk Off from the **22nd of August 1966 to the 23rd of August 1966**. Further to this, parts of the Buchanan and Buntine highways that relate to the Walk Off Route have been renamed. The Council proposes amendments to the listing to correlate the historical route to contemporary maps. The Council's initial assessment concludes that all of these proposed amendments do not alter the National Heritage listed values of the place.

# NGUJIMA-YIN FLOATING PRODUCTION STORAGE AND OFFLOADING FACILITY OPERATIONS AND PYRENEES FACILITY OPERATIONS ENVIRONMENT PLANS

For more than 35 years, Woodside has been developing and operating LNG and oil projects in Australia. Our focus is the safety, reliability, efficiency and environmental performance of our operations and activities.

Woodside consults so that feedback from relevant persons is considered and used to inform the revision of two operations Environment Plans for the Ngujima-Yin Floating Production Storage and Offloading Facility Operations and Pyrenees Facility Operations.

#### Our activities

Woodside plans to continue producing crude oil at the Pyrenees and Ngujima-Yin Floating Production Storage and Offloading (FPSO) facilities and is submitting a five-year revision to the operational Environment Plans. The Environment Plans for the Pyrenees FPSO and Ngujima-Yin FPSO facilities will cover operations including offloading and associated activities, inspection, maintenance, monitoring, and repair of the FPSOs and subsea infrastructure, disconnection and sail-away of the FPSO facilities when required, and production from two proposed additional wells from the Ngujima-Yin FPSO.

The Pyrenees FPSO is located about 45 km northwest of Exmouth, Western Australia. Production began in 2010 and is scheduled to end in 2035. The Ngujima-Yin FPSO is about 50 km, northwest of Exmouth, Western Australia. Production began in 2008 and is scheduled to end in 2028.

We are seeking input from relevant persons whose functions, interests or activities may be affected by continued operations.


#### The environment that may be affected (EMBA)

The EMBA is the largest area where activities could potentially have a direct or indirect impact. The broadest extent of the EMBA takes into consideration planned and unplanned activities, and for these two Environmental Plans, is determined by modelling a highly unlikely release of hydrocarbons from loss of well control or a vessel collision with the FPSO with enough force to breach the hull.

The EMBA represents the merged area of many possible modelled paths that a highly unlikely hydrocarbon release could travel if left unmitigated and depending on the weather and ocean conditions at the time of the release. This means in the highly unlikely event a hydrocarbon release does occur, the whole EMBA will not be affected.



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


At the previous meeting on 8 August 2023, the claim groups for the **Yirrganydji (Irukandji) People (QUD14/2019)** and **Yirrganydji (Irukandji) People #2 (QUD337/2015)** passed resolutions authorising their two claims to be combined with the **Djabugay Nation (QUD692/2016) claim**.

The claim group for the **Djabugay Nation claim** however, did not pass any resolutions about the possible combination – whether for or against. That is why this further meeting is being called. A decision needs to be made, whether for or against, as to whether or not to combine.

If the claims are combined, there will then be only **ONE** claim – the **Djabugay Nation claim** – over the whole of the area of each of these claims. That is, the **Djabugay Nation claim** would be the **ONLY** claim that would cover both the areas within the black outline of the Djabugay Nation (QUD692/2016) claim, and the areas of the Yirrganydji (Irukandji) People claims highlighted in green and purple, as set out in the map.
