

NOTICE INITIATING NEGOTIATIONS WITH NATIVE TITLE PARTIES MINING ACT 1971 (SA) – SECTION 63M

TAKE NOTICE that:

Havilah Resources Limited ACN 077 435 520 of 107 Rundle Street, Kent Town SA 5067 (Havilah) is the registered holder of South Australian Exploration Licence (EL) numbers 5951 being the land described as follows:

EL5951

JACKS FIND AREA – Approximately 140 km northeast of Olary, which incorporates the following areas: Commencing at a point being the intersection of latitude 31°00'S and longitude 140°34'E, then east to longitude 140°41'E, south to latitude 31°05'S, west to longitude 140°34'E, and north to the point of commencement. AREA: 103 km² approximately.

All the within latitudes and longitudes are geodetic and expressed in terms of the Australian Geodetic Datum as defined on p. 4984 of Commonwealth Gazette number 84 dated October 6, 1966 (AGD66) (the Land).

Havilah propose to carry out mining operations on the relevant Land. The general nature of the proposed mining operations that are to be carried out on the Land is as follows:

General nature of proposed mining operations

Exploratory operations to determine the geological structure of the land and presence of economic mineralization and/or water and without limiting the foregoing, such operations may include any of the following: Geophysical surveys including airborne and ground surveys of magnetics, gravity, electrical and seismic methods. Geochemical sampling including radon surveys, soil, rock chip and drainage. Shallow trenching and various drilling methods including auger, rotary mud, reverse circulation, aircore and diamond drilling. Havilah seeks to negotiate a native title mining agreement in respect of that part of the Land not already the subject of agreement(s) and the proposed mining operations with native title parties (if any) as provided for by Part 9B of the Mining Act 1971.

The proposed operations are authorised by the following tenements under the Mining Act 1971: Exploration Licence number 5951.

In this notice a reference to an exploration licence includes that tenement and any extensions, renewals, transfers, assignments, re-grants, or other dealings with that tenement. A reference to Havilah includes its successors and assigns. If, four months after this notice is given as required by the Mining Act 1971, there are no persons registered under the law of the State or Commonwealth as the holders of, or claimants to, native title in the Land, the relevant mining operator may apply ex parte to the Environment, Resources and Development Court for a summary determination authorising entry to the relevant Land for the purpose of carrying out mining operations on that Land, and the conduct of mining operations on that Land.



Description of the agreement area:

The agreement area covers about 32 ha over Lot 1 on SP337297 and part of the Peninsula Developmental Road and is located about 20 km north of Coen (Moomba) in the vicinity of the Coen Aerodrome

Relevant LGA: Cook Shire Council

The agreement contains the following statements:

[Explanatory notes in brackets inserted by the National Native Title Tribunal]

5 Consents

5.1 The parties: (a) consent to the doing of the Agreed Acts to the extent that they are Future Acts; and (b) agree to the validating of any of the Agreed Acts, which are also Future Acts, done prior to Registration.

5.2 The parties consent to the validation of any Future Acts done prior to the Execution Date by the State in the Agreement Area to the extent they were done invalidly for the purposes of Native Title and can be validated in this Agreement.

5.3 The consent at clause 5.2 includes but is not limited to:

(a) the construction, operation, use and maintenance of the Cape York Biosecurity Centre and supporting infrastructure, including access to and use of the areas surrounding the facility; and

(b) the construction, use and maintenance of the water pipeline and pump on Lot 11 on SP171860.

5.4 Clause 5.1 is a statement for the purposes of section 24EB(1)(b) of the NTA and clauses 5.2 and 5.3 are statements for the purposes of section 24EB(1)(a) of the NTA.

5.5 To the extent that any of the Agreed Acts are Future Acts, the parties acknowledge that the Non-Extinguishment Principle applies.

7. New Road

[The State is to use its best endeavours to arrange for the dedication of the New Road]

7.2 For the purposes of Native Title, the parties consent to the dedication of the New Road.

"Agreed Acts" means all acts necessary to give effect to this Agreement including but not limited to any acts done as part of, or in relation to, the acts specified in Schedule 3.

"Cape York Biosecurity Facility" means the facility and any associated infrastructure operated by the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries located on the Agreement Area.

"Future Act" has the meaning given in the NTA.

"New Road" means the area identified and delineated by stations 50-52-51-50 on plan SP337297 attached at Schedule 2.

"Non-Extinguishment Principle" has the meaning given in the NTA.
