



Background

NTSCORP Limited (**NTSCORP**), the native title service provider for NSW, is convening a meeting to authorise the making of an Indigenous Land Use Agreement in accordance with the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth) in relation to land and waters identified at **Annexure A**, which are all within the external boundary of the NNWW Claim, as shown in black outline on the map below.

The Indigenous Land Use Agreement Area includes land and waters which are subject to the Ngemba, Ngiyampaa, Wangaaypuwan and Wayilwan People native title determination application (NSD38/2019). The area that is the subject of the NNWW Claim is bounded by the towns of Brewarrina, Bourke, Coonamble, Gulargambone, Warren, Nyngan, Hillston, Mossiel and Ivanhoe, approximately from the Barwon River in the north, to the Lachlan River in the south, the Castlereagh River in the east and Ivanhoe in the west.

The Indigenous Land Use Agreement is proposed to be between the NNWW People, the Minister for Lands and Property as the Minister administering the *Crown Land Management Act 2016* (NSW) and the Attorney General of New South Wales as the State Minister for New South Wales under the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth).






