

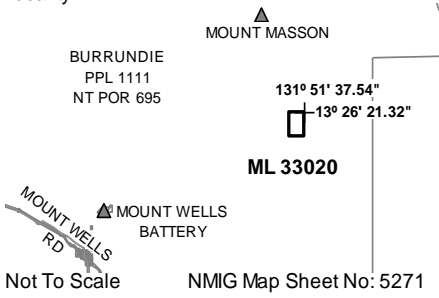
NOTICE OF PROPOSED GRANT OF MINERAL LEASE

NATIVE TITLE ACT 1993 (CTH) SECTION 29

The Honourable Nicole Manison MLA, Northern Territory Minister for Mining and Industry C/- Department of Industry, Tourism and Trade, GPO Box 4550 DARWIN NT 0801, hereby gives notice in accordance with section 29 of the *Native Title Act 1993* (Commonwealth) of her intent to do an act namely to grant the following mineral title application.

The application to which this notice applies:

Mineral Lease 33020 sought by GMG MINING (NT) PTY LTD, ACN 634 618 410 over an area of 207 Hectares depicted below for a term of 30 years, within the MCKINLAY RIVER locality.



Nature of act(s): The grant of a mineral lease under the *Mineral Titles Act 2010* authorises the holder to explore and mine for minerals including (but not limited to) the processing and the removal of minerals from the lease area and the treatment of tailings or other mining material the property of the Crown on the lease area, including any extractive minerals for or in connection with any of the purposes specified in the lease document for a term the Minister thinks fit and to seek renewals. The term for which it is intended to grant the mineral lease commences from the date of grant. Native Title Parties: Any person who is, or becomes a "native title party" within the meaning of the *Native Title Act 1993* is entitled to the negotiation and/or procedural rights provided in Part 2, Division 3, Subdivision P of the *Native Title Act 1993*. Under section 30 of the *Native Title Act 1993*, persons have until 3 months after the notification day to take certain steps to become native title parties in relation to this notice. Background

The area that is the subject of the NNWW Claim is bounded by the towns of Brewarrina, Bourke, Coonamble, Gulargambone, Warren, Nyngan, Hillston, Mossgiel and Ivanhoe, from the Barwon River in the north, to the Lachlan River in the south, the Castlereagh River in the east and Ivanhoe in the west.

The Applicant in the NNWW Claim (**'current Applicant'**) comprises the following persons:

The current Applicant was authorised to act on behalf of the NNWW Claim Group at a NNWW Claim Group meeting held on 29 and 30 August 2015.

Consideration of whether to authorise the Applicant to enter into a section 31 Deed with Tritton Resources Pty Ltd and the Minister for Regional NSW and a Land Access Agreement with Tritton Resources Pty Ltd

Tritton Resources Pty Ltd (**'Tritton Resources'**) have applied for Minister's Consent to prospect (explore) on any land or waters on which native title has not been extinguished within Exploration Licence 4962 (which is located about 50km north-west of Nyngan and is known as the 'Budgery Exploration Area').

Under the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth), the registered native title claimant (**NNWW Applicant**) has a right to negotiate with Tritton Resources in relation to the grant of Minister's Consent. The NNWW Applicant does not have a right to veto the grant of Minister's Consent to prospect.

The Applicant has negotiated a draft Land Access Agreement with Tritton Resources and a draft section 31 Deed with Tritton Resources and the Minister for Regional NSW.

The draft Land Access Agreement includes a package of benefits in exchange for the consent of the Applicant to the grant of Minister's Consent.

In December 2021, Tritton Resources lodged a future act determination application in the National Native Title Tribunal (**'NNTT'**) seeking a determination in relation to the grant of Minister's Consent.

At this NNWW Claim Group meeting, the NNWW Claim Group will be asked:

- (a) whether or not they wish to authorise the Applicant to enter into the draft Land Access Agreement with Tritton Resources and the draft section 31 Deed with Tritton Resources and the Minister for Regional NSW; and
- (b) to consider and make a decision about the next steps the Applicant should take in relation to the future act determination application in the NNTT.

Authorisation of New Applicant

Sadly, in March 2020, Uncle Neville Merritt passed away.

Accordingly, at this NNWW Claim Group meeting the NNWW Claim Group will be asked to consider and make decisions to authorise a new Applicant for the NNWW Claim. This could involve:

- i. reauthorising the 9 remaining members of the current Applicant to be the Applicant; or
- ii. nominating and confirming 1 person to replace Uncle Neville Merritt and reauthorising the 9 remaining members of the current Applicant as well as the 1 additional person to be the Applicant; or
- iii. any new composition of NNWW Claim Group members as the NNWW Claim Group decides.

For example, whether or not the Applicant can make decisions by majority, and whether the Applicant can nominate certain members of the Applicant to sign documents on behalf of the Applicant.

The NNWW Claim Group will consider resolutions and make decisions about amending the NNWW Claim, in compliance with section 251BA of the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth), to reflect any conditions the NNWW Claim Group place on the powers of the NNWW Applicant and the process the NNWW Applicant must undertake in making its decisions and any other amendments necessary to reflect the new Applicant authorised by the NNWW Claim Group, and to ensure that the NNWW Claim is capable of being registered by the National Native Title Tribunal.

Background

The Widjabul Wia-bal Claim was registered in August 2013.

The Widjabul Wia-bal Claim area is an area bounded by: Bagotville, Tuckean Nature Reserve and Tucki Tucki to the south; Bungabbee State Forest and Cawongla to the west; part of Mebbin State Forest, Lillian Rock, and a large part of Nightcap National Park to the north; and Montecollum, Possum Creek, and Alstonville to the east.

Reasons for the Widiabul Wia-bal Claim Group Meeting

1. Update on process for finalisation of the Widiabul Wia-bal Consent Determination and the proposed ILUA

At this Widiabul Wia-bal Claim Group Meeting, NTSCORP intends to discuss with the Widiabul Wia-bal Claim Group:

- a summary of where the Consent Determination and ILUA negotiations are up to;
- the steps the Widiabul Wia-bal Claim Group needs to take in order to proceed towards a Consent Determination and finalise the proposed ILUA; and
- a summary of what native title will look like after a Consent Determination is made and the proposed ILUA registered.

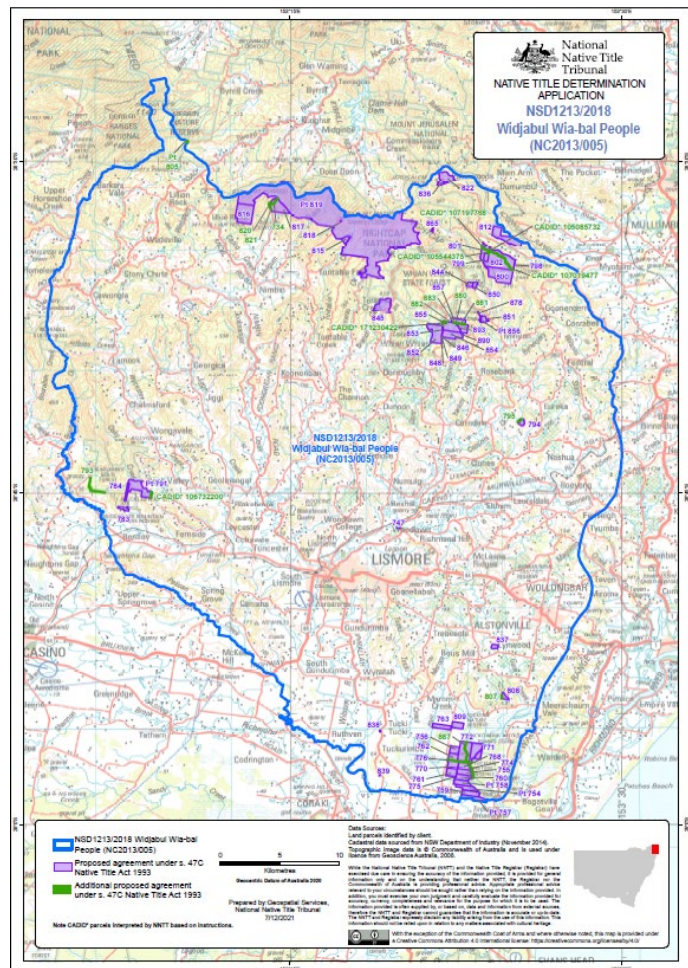
2. Amending the Widiabul Wia-bal Claim Area to include the parcels subject to an agreement under Section 47C of the Native Title Act

The Widiabul Wia-bal Applicant (the Applicant) and the State have been able to reach a proposed agreement on the application of section 47C of the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth) (s 47C) within the external boundary of the Widiabul Wia-bal Claim.

Under s 47C, extinguishment may be disregarded and native title recognised by agreement.

In order for s 47C to apply, the land concerned must be a park area that is held by a Commonwealth or State agency, for the purpose of preserving the natural environment of the area (e.g., a National Park or Nature Reserve). The proposed s 47C agreement with the State would allow Native Title to be recognised over an additional 2,600 hectares of land and waters, including parts of the following areas (marked in **purple** and **green** on the map to the right):

- Boatharbour Nature Reserve
- Tuckean Nature Reserve
- Mucklewee Mountain Nature Reserve
- Goonengerry National Park
- Victoria Park Nature Reserve
- Mount Jerusalem National Park
- Nightcap National Park
- Davis Scrub Nature Reserve



- Snows Gully Nature Reserve
- Tucki Tucki Nature Reserve
- Andrew Johnson Big Scrub Nature Reserve
- Whian Whian State Conservation Area

At this Widjabul Wia-bal Claim Group Meeting, the Widjabul Wia-bal Claim Group will be asked whether or not they wish to:

1. authorise the Applicant to enter into the s 47C Agreement; and
2. authorise the Applicant to amend the Widjabul Wia-bal native title determination application to include the s 47C Agreement Area in the application area, as described in **Attachment A**.

3. Update on the process of establishing Widjabul Wia-bal's Prescribed Body Corporate and discussion of ideas for the proposed governance structure (including the Trust)
