

Aboriginal Community Consultation and Registration of Interest

Niche Environment and Heritage Pty Ltd (Niche) has been engaged by RME Geological Services Pty Ltd on behalf of Golden Deep Ltd (hereafter referred to as the 'Proponent') to assist in the preparation of an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment (ACHA) including Aboriginal community consultation. In accordance with Section 4.1.3 of DECCW (2010), *Aboriginal cultural heritage consultation requirements for proponents 2010*, the Proponent is seeking to consult with any Aboriginal persons or groups who may hold cultural knowledge of, or who have the right or interest in Aboriginal cultural heritage of the Subject Area. The purpose of the consultation will be to assist the Proponent in the preparation of:

- An ACHA.
- Determining the significance of any Aboriginal objects and/or places within the Subject Area.
- Appropriate management recommendations for any Aboriginal objects and/or places that might be identified during the process.
- A subsequent AHIP to manage any Aboriginal objects identified during the Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment and to assist Heritage NSW in their consideration and determination of the application.








Figure 1 The indicative EMBA associated with North West Shelf and Julimar Exploration Wellhead Decommissioning Environment Plan

Figure 1 describes the Operational Areas and the Environment That May Be Affected (EMBA) based on a composite of many different paths and furthest distance where a highly unlikely, unplanned event could have an impact based on weather and ocean conditions.

Woodside has undertaken an assessment to identify potential impacts and risks to the marine environment arising from both planned and unplanned activities. Mitigation and management measures have been developed for each of the risks identified and will be outlined in the relevant Environment Plan (EP).

Impacts associated with the planned activities include the physical presence of up to two vessels, interaction with other marine users, seabed disturbance (such as infrastructure placement) and other vessel impacts (such as noise, light, air emissions and marine discharges). Impacts that could occur due to an unplanned event include hydrocarbon releases (marine diesel or other vessel fuels), vessel collisions with marine fauna, additional seabed disturbance, introduced marine species, accidental loss of waste or other discharges.

Figure 1 illustrates indicative EMBA to support persons' or organisations' understanding of whether their functions, interests or activities may be affected by the proposed activities, with detailed information found in Woodside's Consultation Information Sheet.



North West Shelf and Julimar Exploration Wellhead Decommissioning Environment Plan

Notice under Section 29 of the Native Title Act 1993 Exploration Licence Numbers EL8521 (Act 1992)

This notice is given in accordance with the requirements of section 29 of the Native Title Act 1993 (Commonwealth).

Description of the nature of the act

Pursuant to the Native Title (Right to Negotiate (Exclusion) – NSW Land) Determination No. 1 of 1996 (Cth), Exploration Licence EL8521 includes a condition to the effect that the holder must not prospect on any land or waters covered by the licence in relation to which native title exists without the prior written consent of the Minister administering the Mining Act 1992 (the 'Native Title Condition').

The Minister administering the Mining Act 1992 intends to give consent to prospecting on land subject to native title in part of the licence in accordance with the Native Title (Right to Negotiate (Inclusion) – NSW Land) Approval No. 1 of 1996 (Cth).

Holder's details

Gold and Copper Resources Pty Limited (ACN 124 534 863) is the holder of Exploration Licence 8521 for Group 1 minerals.

The licence contains a condition that the holder must not prospect on any land or waters on which native title exists without the prior consent of the Minister administering the Mining Act 1992. The licence holder has sought the Minister's consent to conduct prospecting activities in parts of the licence area.

Description of area that may be affected

Exploration Licence 8521 covers about 27 units and is situated approximately 21 kilometres south southwest of Bathurst, in the State of NSW.




The North Queensland Land Council (NQLC) will hold an authorisation meeting on **Thursday, 10 August 2023** to which all members of the Jirrbal People #4 native title claim group (as described below) are invited to attend. This is an important meeting where binding decisions about the Jirrbal People #4 native title claim are proposed to be made.

PURPOSE OF MEETING

The purpose of this meeting is to consider, and if appropriate, make decisions about the following:

- CONFIRM** the agreed and adopted decision making process to be used for making decisions at the meeting.
- AUTHORISE** a draft agreement under section 87A of the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth) (s87A agreement) and consent determination of native title for the Part A area (Part A determination). Please note that the draft s87A agreement and consent determination will be tabled at the meeting.
- AUTHORISE** the nomination of the Wabubadda Aboriginal Corporation RNTBC (ICN 7117) to be the agent prescribed body corporate for the Part A determination.
- CONFIRM** the amended Jirrbal People #4 claim group description (as authorised by two group meetings on 6 December 2022) is to be used in the Jirrbal People #4 claimant application for a determination of native title (Form 1), and that the Form 1 should be amended accordingly so that the claim group description in the Form 1 aligns with the description of the Jirrbal People Native Title Holders for the for the Part A determination.
- CONFIRM** that the conditions on the authority of the Applicant, previously authorised in 2015, remain in effect.
