Ideally, you will have experience working with or applying coach and official development and adult learning techniques; have a solid understanding of sport and active recreation planning and delivery within a community environment; the ability to work effectively with sporting organisations, local and regional councils and community representatives and have highly effective verbal, written and listening communication skills. A willingness to work outside core business hours and the ability to obtain a Working with Children Certificate and NT drivers licence is essential.
