The ALT is a statutory board convened under the *Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority Act 1972* to manage the extensive Aboriginal Lands Trust in accordance with the Act.

The Act allows for a total of seven Aboriginal people to be on the board, including one Chair, and six members. The State Government is seeking applications from suitably qualified Aboriginal people to fill any current or future vacancies on the ALT. Member selection will consider cultural and geographical, gender and generational diversity.

Applicants will be required to commit their time and expertise to ensuring the ALT fulfils its statutory obligations. Applicants will be required to provide a current Police Clearance as part of the application process, prior to appointment.

On 15 April 2024, the Office of the Registrar of Indigenous Corporations (ORIC) placed Waanyi PBC under special administration to initiate and ensure corporate reform in preparation for the return of the corporation to member control.

About the Opportunity

Waanyi PBC seeks to appoint a dynamic Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to report to the Board, responsible for the strategic direction, growth, and operational excellence of the organisation. 

A 'non-claimant' application has been made to the Federal Court of Australia (Federal Court) seeking a determination that native title does not exist in the area described below. The Applicant has a non-native title interest in the area, which is set out in their application and summarised below.

Under the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth), there can be only one determination of native title for an area. Unless there is a relevant native title claim, as defined in section 24FE, over the area described below on or before **16 October 2024**, the area may be subject to protection under section 24FA and **acts may be done which extinguish or otherwise affect native title**.

A person who claims to hold native title rights and interests in this area may wish to file a native title claim application or become a party to this non-claimant application. These may be the only opportunities to have those rights and interests taken into account in the Federal Court's determination. Any other person may also wish to become a party.

If you want to become a party to this application, you must file a Form 5 (Notice of Intention to become a Party) with the Federal Court, **on or before 16 October 2024**. Further information regarding how to file a Form 5 is available from www.fedcourt.gov.au. After **16 October 2024**, you will need to seek leave from the Federal Court to become a party.
