### What you'll be doing

This position is responsible for providing culturally sensitive support to pregnant women and their families during pregnancy, facilitating informal support groups and facilitating access to appropriate services.

This position also works towards improving health outcomes and wellbeing of Aboriginal families on the Central Coast with young children (0-5 years of age) by providing culturally sensitive care navigation for the family.

Care is provided via telephone, telehealth where available, home visits and hospital and/or community settings.

The Aboriginal Health Worker works in partnership with the family and with Registered Midwives in the antenatal and post-natal period, and Child and Family Health Nurses up to the child reaching school age for Aboriginal women and women whose babies identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander as per Ngiyang Aboriginal Pregnancy, Child & Family Health Service Model of Care.
