The Institute is seeking esteemed academic to join an established team of colleagues working in Nursing. The **Senior Lecturer in Nursing** will be required to teach, conduct research, engage in practice-based activities, publish and attract research funding.

You will promote the Institute, establish and maintain links and partnerships with the academic, industry, professional communities and national Indigenous Communities.

In this role you will provide leadership in the development, coordination and delivery of integrated teaching and research programs in the area of Nursing.

The role is 2 year fixed-term contract based at our Geelong Waurin Ponds Campus.

Your key responsibilities will include:
