Forming part of the International Security, Humanitarian and Consular Group (ISG), the Consular and Crisis Management Division (CCD) provides consular services and assistance to Australians overseas and coordinates the Australian government response to international crises. Consular services, assistance and advice might be provided to Australian in response to a major emergency or disaster or to an incident such as an accident, illness, death, crime, arrest or detention.

Opportunities are available for Consular Officers in several branches at several levels in CCD. As a Consular Officer you will contribute to the agenda to modernise Australia's consular capability to ensure it remains fit for purpose, flexible and resilient to respond to overseas emergencies and support Australians overseas. There is also the possibility to serve overseas on a short-term basis.

Depending on the role into which you are placed, you may be required to obtain and maintain a Working with Vulnerable People/Children registration (or equivalent).
