Candidates must have sufficient time to effectively commit to GPAP Board work (as a guide approximately 15 – 20 hours per month) and as a priority one of the following three areas of skills and experience:

- **Demonstrated financial experience** – candidates who have a CPA or CA will be favourably considered.
- **Demonstrated philanthropic fundraising experience** – candidates who have expertise in philanthropic fundraising and relevant networks will be favourably considered.
- **Demonstrated digital technology experience** – candidates who have expertise in digital media, sales and marketing will be favourably considered.

Ideally candidates will also have:

- experience in Greenpeace, campaigning and/or expertise in environmental or wider movements
- relevant governance experience, skills, and availability to be considered in future to become the GPAP Board Chair
- relevant networks suitable to providing significant value to the GPAP Board as it scales up for greater achievement.
