The successful applicant must have an understanding of the issues affecting Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people and an ability to communicate sensitively and effectively with Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander People. People of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent are strongly encouraged to apply.

The WNSW PHN is one of 31 Primary Health Networks across Australia established by the Australian Government to support frontline health services. The Role

Western NSW Primary Health Network (WNSW PHN) has received funding from the NSW Ministry of Health via Western NSW Local Hospital District to undertake a Collaborative Commissioning (CC) Joint Development Phase (JDP). This will see Western NSW Primary Health Network working together with the other organisations to establish a response to Chronic Disease for our region. The Collaborating Organisations include Western NSW Local Hospital District, Far West Local Hospital District and NSW Rural Doctors Network. It will be crucial that services implemented are culturally safe, responsive to community needs and actively involves the voice of the clinicians who will deliver services.

Each Partner Lead will engage with and potentially be based with one of the Collaborating Organisations to ensure the JDP deliverables are completed and delivered to the NSW Ministry of Health by the target date.

Lead Partners will co-ordinate with contracted consultants, Collaborating Organisation staff, working party members and others to monitor the completion milestones and undertake progress reporting as required.

Ensure JDP activities are completed and that codesign incorporates Clinician expertise and the lived experience of our General Practitioners, Allied Health Teams, Aboriginal Peoples and Patients.
