We now have an exciting opportunity for a **Research Assistant** to join The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Program, supporting on a project aiming to improve food and water security in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

The Research Assistant will work closely with the Food and Water for Life Project team to support the project management and provide research support to the project (3 days). The Research Assistant will also provide support for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander engagement and coordination of aspects of the 'Join Us' Research Register. The Research Assistant will work closely with and be supported by the broader Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Program Team at TGI to support existing and new programs relating to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health with a focus on food and nutrition. There is also potential for someone with the right interests and drive to progress to achieve their further education goals, potentially leading to a Masters degree or PhD

Key responsibilities of the role will include:

- Providing project management and administrative support to the Food and Water for Life Project
- Organising agendas and papers for meetings and documenting outcomes and actions

- Liaising between members of the project team (TGI, Yuwaya Ngarra-li staff at UNSW, Dharriwaa Elders Group, Walgett Aboriginal Medical Services and others) to help co-ordinate actions
- Lead communications between partner institutions and ensure regular updates to project team
- Assist in report writing and ensuring final reports are submitted within the required deadlines
- Provide ongoing support to Food and Water for Life team in program delivery
- Provide feedback to the Research Advisory Group and Food and Water for Life working party involved in the project on project progress and results
- Monitor program delivery and ensure ongoing quality of program
- Provide executive support for the Aboriginal Advisory group for 'Join Us' Register
- Liaison with AH&MRC and potential "partner" organisations
- Assist in planning & implementing consultation processes in relation to Join Us Register

Desired Skills and Experience

- Experience within public health, Aboriginal health research or medical research, or in health care environments
- Interest in and capacity to establish expertise in food and water security, nutrition and public health
- Experience within Aboriginal health care and/or Aboriginal community liaison experience with an understanding of the issues affecting Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people
- Ability to effectively communicate and work with Aboriginal community organisations and staff
- Excellent planning and organisational skills, including the ability to manage a range of tasks with conflicting priorities and to meet deadlines whilst maintaining accuracy
- Strong project management skills particularly in a research, coordination and development environment
- Demonstrated ability to maintain confidentiality and comply with privacy requirements
- Proven ability to work as a member of a team as well as completing tasks without supervision
- Full NSW driver license and willingness to travel
