About the role

The Lecturer - Medical Education in First Nations Health is a scholar in First Nations health. While establishing their own academic career, the incumbent in this position plays an important role in the further development and implementation of the School's First Nations Health curriculum within the Doctor of Medicine (MD).

The Lecturer - Medical Education in First Nations Health will work with academic and professional staff in the DME and its associated clinical schools, and other key stakeholders in the area of First Nations health to promote and facilitate the implementation of an effective, coordinated and integrated program of First Nations health in the MD. The incumbent will also draw upon their networks to recommend appropriate resources to support the MD's delivery. The Lecturer will report to and work closely with the incumbent Director of First Nations Health who occupies a continuing position that extends beyond this task-specific project.

The Faculty and the Melbourne Medical School are committed to actively implementing the Reconciliation Action Plan and this position would be expected to contribute to these aims.
