Salary: Academic Level A (\$73,669 – \$99,964 p.a.) or Level B (\$105,232– \$124,958 p.a.) plus 17% superannuation. Level of appointment is subject to qualification and experience.

A Research Fellow position is available in the Melbourne Institute for a quantitative researcher to work as part of a team on the NHMRC-funded project *Understanding the factors influencing wellbeing among Indigenous youth in the Northern Territory*.

This project is being conducted by an interdisciplinary team of Indigenous and non-Indigenous researchers across the fields of economics, psychology, public health, health system administration and machine-learning. It involves working with linked longitudinal administrative data from the Northern Territory. The research team is primarily based at the University of Melbourne,

University of Sydney, University of Western Australia and Menzies School of Health Research in Darwin.

Development of Indigenous quantitative research capacity is one of the objectives of this project. We are thus looking for an Indigenous researcher to fill this vacancy.
